Fifth Sunday of Easter

'Made in Heaven'

Throughout the weeks of Eastertide we are running a series of articles on the Sacrament of Marriage and its central importance in the life of the Christian community. The articles are written by parishioner David Chiswell who has taught, formed and prepared couples for marriage for many years in his capacity as a leading member of Catholic Marriage Care, and has a wealth of wisdom and insight to offer through these reflections.



David writes... John Donne (1572-1631) one of the great English poets described marriage in his sermon at the marriage of Sir Thomas Egerton thus "Marriage among Christians, is herein Magnum mysterium, A Sacrament in such a sense; a mysterious signification of the union of the soule with Christ; when both persons profess the Christian Religion, in general, there arises some signification of that spiritual union".

Thomas C. Pinckney, in a homily given at the Community Bible Church in Wlliamstown, MA in 1997 identified three ingredients that seem to be the key to turning the mystery into a miracle:

Harmony

The unity between husband and wife is not something that happens regularly or occasionally, the two are essentially one always. I am one with my wife in the same sense that I am one with my body, we are both built up and honoured and growing. If my wife hurts, I hurt. It's rather like playing in an orchestra; if we have the same music sheet, if we both understand rhythm and timing, the music sounds wonderful, if not

If this sounds easy, it is not; we must work at it constantly.

Sacrificial Love

Bishop Curry at the wedding of Prince Harry to Megan Markle included the following "He (Jesus) didn't die for anything he could get out of it. Jesus did not get an honorary doctorate for dying. He wasn't getting anything out of it. He gave up his life, he sacrificed his life, for the good of others, for the good of the other, for the wellbeing of the world... for us.

That is what love is. Love is not selfish and self-centred. Love can be sacrificial, and in so doing, becomes redemptive. And that way of unselfish, sacrificial, redemptive love changes lives, and it can change this world."

Perfecting in Marriage

Aristotle distinguished three meanings for perfection:

- Something is perfect when it is complete, it has all the requisite parts.
- Something that is so good it could not be better.
- Something which has attained its purpose.

All three of these apply when we are seeking to achieve perfection in marriage; we do it by helping each other and through awareness of the different elements that define perfection. We might ask ourselves the following questions:

Have I done everything needed to complete this task? Is there anything I could do to contribute helping my spouse in seeking perfection?

How could I contribute to making something the best ever?

Does what I'm doing make something fit for purpose? Do we, as a couple, agree on the purpose of any task, event or happening in our lives?





Admittance to Hospital?



CARD 40th Anniversary Event - Saturday 25 May

Catholic Association for Racial Justice was established 40 years ago on 16 June 1984 at a meeting of approximately 25 'founding members' from a variety of ethnic backgrounds. The Agenda for Change builds on the experiences and learning of the past 40 years and puts forward a strategy for bringing about greater equality and creating a racially just church and society, a goal which continues to elude us in the 21st century.



New Lectionary -CCS launches website

The Vatican's Dicastery for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments has confirmed the approval by the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales for a new Lectionary. The Lectionary, which includes the scripture readings for Mass and the sacraments, will come into use in parishes in England & Wales and in Scotland from Advent 2024. The Catholic Truth Society (CTS) is the publisher, and they have launched a <u>new website</u>.



Pre-orders for the Lectionary will begin soon. Here are some FAQs from the site.

Why is the Lectionary changing?

The lectionary is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The process began with the Roman Missal in 2011 and has continued to work through all the other liturgical rites. The changes are intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, using better and more up-to-date biblical scholarship and to use a text which is more proclaimable.

What translation will the new Lectionary use?

The new lectionary will be using the English Standard Version – Catholic Edition of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter.

When will the Lectionary be available to pre-order?

The new Lectionary will be available to pre-order after Easter 2024.

When will the Lectionary be in stock?

The Lectionary will be in stock in October 2024.

When will the new Lectionary need to be used?

The new Lectionary will come into force on the first Sunday of Advent 2024.

Can parishes keep using the old Lectionary?

No, parishes will need to change over to the new lectionary on 1st December 2024.

Which countries will be using the new Lectionary?

This version will be used in England and Wales, and Scotland.

Other than the translation of Scripture, will there be any other key differences between the new Lectionary and the old one?

The lectionary will have a fully up-to-date Proper of Saints including the new universal and national feasts that have been instituted since the publication of the last lectionary.

How many volumes will the new lectionary be?

The new lectionary is currently set to consist of 4 volumes:

Sundays, Solemnities, Feasts of the Lord.

Weekdays: Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time (weeks 1-9), Lent, Easter.

Proper of Saints: December - May, Commons.

Weekdays: Ordinary Time (6-34).

Proper of Saints: June - November, Commons.

Ritual Masses, Masses for Various Needs and Occasions, Votive Masses, Masses for the Dead.

How many editions will be produced?

There will be three different sizes of the lectionary: a full-size Ambo edition (the same size as the Altar Missal) – a smaller chapel edition (the same size as the Chapel Missal) and a study edition for liturgy preparation (the same size as the Study Missal).

How much money is the Lectionary likely to cost?

Print prices are volatile at the moment, but a full set will be several hundred pounds.

Will CTS be producing new people's missals?

CTS and other publishers will be producing people's Missals in due course including Sunday, Weekday and Daily Missals.
