Welcome to St Patrick's Church. The humility of God is an amazing concept. Jesus Christ, the Son of God, His Word through whom the universe came into existence is born in a humble stable, becomes a refugee, a carpenter and an itinerant preacher is going to die a shameful death. When He tried to explain this to His followers, they didn't really understand. In the same way, we often do not really understand suffering, even though we are surrounded by it. When, with child-like faith (not child-ish!) we accept and carry our cross, we discover a peace that the world cannot give.

Hayling Holiday Lunches—Our next Collection will be on Sunday 20th October (3rd Sunday of the month). This Sunday will be a Family Mass and have a "Harvest Festival" theme. As we start towards winter (and Christmas) it would be wonderful to be able to give just a little more this month for this very worthy cause here on Hayling Island.

Are you a pensioner concerned about the proposed loss of winter fuel payment for this year? Being in receipt of Pension Credit will entitle you to the winter fuel allowance BUT you must be entitled to P.C. during the qualifying period of 16th-22nd September 2024 to receive this year's winter fuel allowance. Therefore it's imperative you claim NOW.

You can claim Pension credit if your weekly income is less than £218.15 if you're single or £332.95 if you're a couple.

Even if your weekly income is higher than these thresholds, you could still claim Guarantee Credit if you meet one of the following criteria:

You are a carer, have a severe disability, you have certain housing costs, such as service charges, you're responsible for a child or young person who usually lives with you. There isn't a savings limit for Pension Credit. However, if you have over £10,000 in savings, this will affect how much you receive. The rules are complicated so if in doubt apply on line at gov.uk Pension Credit or Telephone 0800 99 1234
