**10<sup>th</sup> November 2024, Thirty-second of the Year, The widow's mighty mite Parish Mass Book:** pages 154-157. **Prayer of the Church:** Week 4

**<u>1 Kings 17:10-16</u>** In the middle of a famine a poor widow shares the last of her food with the prophet Elijah; far from losing by doing this she is enriched.

Hebrews 9:24-28 Through his death Christ has taken our sins upon himself and has opened the door for us to salvation.

Mark 12:38-34 Other people saw the offering of the widow as the least; in the eyes of Jesus it was the greatest.

<u>The Year of Luke</u> In Advent, starting in just a month, we proclaim, for many of the Sundays of the year, the Gospel according to St Luke. During November it would be a great idea to read the whole of this Gospel. The writing is very beautiful. St Luke includes fine songs such as the *Magnificat*. He is also said to have listened closely to Mary, Our Blessed Mother, as he wrote. He certainly writes with a sensitivity to the work of both women and men in Jesus' mission. He tells many of the parables which teach us so much about God. It could be best of all if several people shared the reading across a few sessions.
