Page 82 Jeremiah 33: 14-16 1 Thessalonians 3: 12 to 4: 2 Gospel Luke 21: 25-28, 14-16 This weekend we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent, the beginning of the liturgical year. The Advent season includes the four Sundays that precede Christmas to prepare for the birth of Jesus. In this season, we recall two central elements of our faith; the final coming of the Lord in glory and the incarnation of the Lord. Key themes are watchful waiting, preparation and justice. The first reading is from Jeremiah, the prophet of hope, who was from a priestly family and was born in a little village called Anathoth, close to Jerusalem. In those days Josiah was king in Judah (640 to 609), a God fearing man who was killed in battle at Megiddo by invading Egyptians. Jeremiah was waiting and hoping for an ideal descendant of King David, the Messiah of God, who would bring security, righteousness and justice to God's people. He assures us that the Lord of Justice will fulfil His promises and, hence, that we should not be afraid, in spite of frightening events and almost universal moral degradation. In the second reading to the Thessalonians, St Paul gives us instructions about how Christians should conduct themselves as they wait for "the coming of Our Lord Jesus with all his saints". He urges us to put God's promise of peace into action by cultivating a spirit of love for others. We are told to strengthen our hearts in holiness and to abound in love for one another. In Luke's Gospel Jesus prophesies the signs that will accompany the end of the present world of matter, space and time with the Second Coming of Jesus in glory as our Judge to give us the rewards our lives on earth have earned. Jesus encourages us to be expectant, optimistic, vigilant and well prepared. "When these things begin to take place, straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near. Jesus wants us to face the future with confidence in God's justice. Malcolm.

St Andrew's Cross, the white cross of Scotland, is part of the Union Jack.

6.30 pm Mass	<b>Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> St Bibiana</b> Patron saint of hangover cures. Roman virgin and the daughter of a Christian Roman Knight who was sent into exile after being tortured for his Christian beliefs. Bibiana's mother was beheaded and the two sisters were left in poverty. Her sister died when they were arrested. She refused to renounce her faith. Martyred in 360. Herbs grew from her grave with medicinal properties that helped the cure of hangovers. Now the site of St Bibiana Basilica in Rome.						
10 am Mass	10 am Mass Tuesday 3 <sup>rd</sup> St Francis Xavier . Spanish Basque born 1506. Doctorate of Law at Bologna University. The 11 years at Paris University. One of a group of 7 priests who started the Jesuits in Paris. Started his missional work in Goa and then other parts of India and Ceylon. Then to Malaysia, Maluku Islands and Japan. He died a he started work in China. Eventually buried in Goa.						
SVP Social 1 pm to 3 pm	<b>Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> St John Damascene</b> Born 675 in Damascus, An Arabic Christian in Syria where Islam was spreading rapidly. Educated with Muslim books and Greek Christian books. Greek and Christian communities were tolerated by the Islamic authority. Administrator in Muslim court. Hermit at Mar Saba monastery, Jerusalem,						
6.30 pm Mass	founded by the great theologian and hermit St Sabas. John was one of the greatest theologians and philosophers of the Eastern Church. Produced a large number of works and sermons. Devotion to Virgin Mary. Died 749 at 74.						
10 am Mass	<b>Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> St Birinus</b> . French Benedictine monk born 600. Came to England in 634, landing at Southampton, then Hamwic, in the St Mary's area as "Apostle to the West Saxons" sent by Pope Honorius I as a missionary. Founded St Mary's Church whose football team centuries later formed the basis of Southampton FC, then called the "Saints" after the church. Made Bishop of Winchester then Bishop of Dorchester-on-Thames, 10 miles south of Oxford. Established many new churches in both dioceses. Very successful ministry and preaching						
NO MASS	converting many people until his death in 650 <b>Friday 6<sup>th</sup> St Nicholas of Myra</b> Born 270 in Asia Minor now Turkey. Worked for social justice in his youth and did a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Made Bishop of Myra. Imprisoned in the "Great Persecution" of Christians by Roman Emperor Diocletian. When released he inherited great wealth which he used to help the poor. Legend of helping 3 poor daughters with dowry so they could marry rather then go into prostitution. To give the bags of gold secretly he threw them through the bedroom window and the gold landed in the girl's stockings hanging at the end of her bed. Basis of Santa Clauss giving presents to young people at Christmas. Died in 343 aged 73.						
6 pm Confessions 6.30pm Vigil Mass	<b>Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> St Ambrose</b> Born 340 in Germany to Roman Christian family. Studied law, Eloquent speaker in court. Provincial Governor. Made Bishop of Milan due to his eloquence in uniting the clergy and people with orthodox beliefs. Great theologian. Baptised St Augustine of Hippo, the famous saint from North Africa.

#### Are you able to host the Posada, figures of Mary, Joseph and the donkey, in your home for the night?

Leading up to Christmas, Posada is an old Mexican tradition where young people, dressed as Mary and Joseph, travel from house to house asking for a room for the night and tell the story about the imminent arrival of Jesus. On Christmas Eve they visit the local church and react the nativity and place figures of Mary and Joseph in the crib.

The modern Posada uses nativity figures of Mary, Joseph and the donkey who travel from place to place in the parish. This gives individual parishioners the chance to "host" the Posada and to create their own celebration of the real message of Christmas, making room for Jesus in their lives. Our Posada will be blessed at St Vincent de Paul on the First Sunday of Advent, 1<sup>st</sup> December at the 9.30 am Mass.

Parishioners wishing to host the Posada should fill in the "*Posada Journey Rota*" in the church porch with your name and contact details. The person hosting the Posada on the day before you will deliver the Posada to you at an agreed time. You are then expected to make arrangements for the Posada to be delivered to the next host on the following day. For the evening that you host the Posada, you might like to invite family and friends to join in your celebration, or you might prefer a quiet evening of prayer and reflection. A sheet of suggested prayers is available. Hosting the Posada can be an opportunity to share our faith with family and friends but, above all, it is a chance to celebrate the period of Advent and think about our journey towards the great feast of Christmas.
