# **Sunday Reflection**

#### THEME: A VOICE CRIES IN THE WILDERNESS

Last week we started our preparations for Christ's coming at Christmas. In our reflection, we focused on two things: the need to watch ourselves or stay awake and the need to pray. Today, we are going to look at John the Baptist; a voice that cries out in the wilderness.

In today's gospel, we hear the task given to John, Son of Zacchariah, in the desert. He is commissioned to go out and preached a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins in the following words: "A voice cries in the wilderness: prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight, every valley will be filled in, and every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth. (Lk 3:4-6; Is 40:3-5). A summary of his message was a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. It calls us to prepare a way for the Lord by doing away with all forms of obstacles. That is why valleys have to be filled; mountains and hills be laid low and winding roads be straightened. John's message was a very straight forward message and the people who listened to him observed these in their lives.

I would like to apply John's message in relation to three things from the second reading of today: the need to improve our knowledge of God, deepen our perceptions of things and spread the good news as well.

When we were baptised, we became kings, priests and prophets. Our prophetic mission enjoined on us the responsibility to bring the Good News of God to everyone.

We need to sincerely ask ourselves whether we carry out this task. St. Paul was very happy with the Christians at Philippi because they took upon themselves the task of spreading the Good News. What about us? One thing I know is that we can't bring to readers what we don't know/have. That is why I suggest that we need to spend time to improve our knowledge of God and the Church and deepen our perceptions of things. This means we must read scriptures, the doctrine and documents of the Church and other Christian literature to prepare ourselves in this regard. By doing this we improve our knowledge only. But if we read and reflect on them in the quiet of our hearts and ask the Holy Spirit to help us, we shall then deepen our perceptions of things. This will then be the base for our Christian daily living.

For us to really prepare for Christmas, we must join John the Baptist to be the voice that cries out in the desert. We can do this by learning and deepening our knowledge of the faith. May John the Baptist help us in this task.
