# Second Sunday of Advent

# Farvin Gonsalves writes...



My name is Farvin Gonsalves and I'm a seminarian for the Diocese of Portsmouth. I am currently in the year of Pastoral Theology (Year 3) at Allen Hall Seminary in London. This year is divided into two parts: Part 1 (Sept – Nov) in the seminary and Part 2 (Dec – Jun) in the Parish. I am resident in St Colman's Parish in Cosham.

I'm originally from Goa, India. I was brought up in a Catholic family. As a child, I saw faith and reason opposed to each other, and I prioritised my school education over my faith. But while I was preparing for my Confirmation, I had my first conversion experience. It was at a retreat and after that I started developing a

personal relationship to Christ. I also became a catechist as I wanted to share the love of Christ that I had experienced. In 2015, I moved to the UK (Reading) and God blessed me with a job as a software tester.

I first felt called to the priesthood after the Maundy Thursday Mass in 2018. I was praying before the Blessed Sacrament, and I got a thought that I should become a priest. So, I asked God to give me a sign. I opened the hymn book to the hymn 'Oh the word of my Lord' and started singing it silently and as I sang the first verse,

Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you through and through, I chose you to be mine. Before you left your mother's side, I called to you, my child, to be my sign.

I realised that it was God speaking to me at that very moment.

I still wasn't sure why this was happening to me and why God wanted me to become a priest. I had a good

job, I had just bought a house with my brother, I was giving my time and using my gifts in the Church as a Catechist. Wasn't that enough? Also, there were so many better and holier men than me. Why me? I struggled with these thoughts hoping they would go away, but they didn't. On Good Shepherd Sunday, I heard there was a Vocations Evening and I decided to go. This was the first time I spoke about my call. After attending a few retreats and talks with the vocations director and other priests, I decided to apply to diocese.

My first year of formation was called a propaedeutic year which is a year before you start seminary. I spent it in Shrewsbury Cathedral from 2019 to 2020. This gave me an opportunity to explore the faith, to ground my spiritual life and familiarise myself with community life. At the end of that year, the bishop sent me to major seminary at St Mary's College Oscott, which is in Sutton Coldfield. My first year at Oscott was memorable. There were challenging days, but I got through it, and I was quite happy being there. But in my second year, things began to take a turn. I began finding



the intellectual programme very demanding and certain changes began to overwhelm me. Instead of relying on God's grace I started to rely on myself. This is a recipe for disaster! In November 2021 I decided to leave seminary as it got 'all too much'. I was done with seminary, but God wasn't done with me.

My parents asked me to go to Goa with them for a break. Little did I know what was in store for me there. Apparently, they had a plan to get me married, they asked me if I would be willing to meet up with a girl from very good Catholic family. Clearly, I said No! I needed some time to process the last two years, to decide what I'm going to do next and what God wants me to do next. I returned to the UK two months later and got a job with the same company as before and began working. I also continued to serve as a catechist in my home parish.

In July 2021, I attended the ordination of Fr James Lewis. When Fr James lay prostrate on the floor, I felt God call me to the priesthood again. After the ordination, I met the bishop and he

said to me, "The door is always open if you

want to come back." God was calling me to the priesthood again, but I decided to wait and pray about it. In January 2023, I attended the World Youth Day meeting in Winchester, and we were reflecting on the Annunciation. During the reflection, everyone was asked the question: what is God calling you to do? As I meditated on this question the answer became clear

to me that God is still calling me to become a priest. I went to Confession and spent time with Jesus in adoration.

Now the time had come to take some action. So, I contacted the Vocations Director and expressed my desire to continue with the formation of the diocesan priesthood. I was accepted and Bishop Philip sent me to Allen Hall to continue my formation.

It's great to be back in seminary, meeting men from different walks of life but all discerning the vocation to the priesthood. Last year was very rewarding, and I've learnt so much. The next six months in Cosham and the Havant Pastoral Area are going to be a major part of my formation journey.

Please pray for me and all other seminarians.

#### 7.30am Mass on Monday 9 December

Taken from the recent Portsmouth E-News...

Monday, 9th December, is the great Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary (transferred this year from 8th December which is the Second Sunday of Advent). Mary Immaculate is the Patron of our Diocese and so Monday is definitely a day on which to attend Mass to pray for us all. This feast was celebrated in the East from the eight century and in the ninth century was kept in many places in the West. Pope Pius IX extended the celebration to the universal Church when he proclaimed the Dogma of the Immaculate Conception on 8th December 1854. In that definition he expressed its precise meaning, affirming the constant faith of the Church: that Our Lady was conceived free from the stain of the original sin from the moment of her conception. It was a privilege unique to Mary, and a fitting one, for she would one day carry in her womb the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. St. John Henry Newman wrote that "there is no difference in kind between her and us, though an inconceivable difference of degree. She and we are both simply saved by the grace of Christ." The Immaculate Conception marks the beginning of human redemption. Mary is the first redeemed human being, the first of a new creation in Christ.

Here is the Collect of the Mass: O God, who by the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin, prepared a worthy dwelling for your Son, grant, we pray, that, as you preserved her from every stain by virtue of the Death of your Son, which you foresaw, so, through her intercession, we, too, may be cleansed and admitted to your presence. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

#### **Christmas Crib Offerings 2024**

In the Diocese, our annual Christmas Crib offerings are given alternately one year to the Friends of the Holy Land and one year to the Knights of the Holy Sepulchre. This year, 2024, our Christmas Crib offerings will go to the Knights of the Holy Sepulchre (KHS). The KHS is widely believed to date back to 1099 A.D., to the first crusade. For centuries their mission has been to support the Christian community in the Holy Land. Today, made up of 30,000

members from 40 countries, lay people, priests and religious, they financially support Christians in the Middle East, and, above all, pray for them. They fund many works that support the Christians living in the Holy Land, thus ensuring that they survive and that the holy sites are still populated by Christians and do not become museums. The Knights do everything they can to help with practical projects to stabilise Christian communities. The key partner for the KHS in the Holy Land is the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem



and through the Patriarchate, they fund-raise to maintain schools, formation, charitable and social activities. The need to help this year is hugely urgent, thanks to the war in the Holy Land. Thank you in advance for your generosity!

# Admittance to Hospital?

When a Catholic is admitted to hospital, the family should ensure that the Catholic Chaplaincy is contacted so that appropriate support can be given. It is suggested that the patient have a note to give to hospital staff on admission, notifying staff that they are Catholic and would appreciate the Catholic Chaplaincy service. This could be followed up by a telephone call from the family to the ward to ensure the request is actioned. When a person is due to go into hospital, please also let your parish priest know so that he can administer the Sacrament of the Sick where appropriate.

# International day for ending violence against women and girls

25th November, the International day for ending violence against women and girls (VAWG), are the 16 Days of Action to raise awareness of the global issue of violence against women and girls. We are encouraged to take part in events, campaign, educate and advocate for ending VAWG. The UK has declared this to be a national emergency and World Health Organisation as a pandemic.

Pope Francis has issued a call to all Catholics to use our power to bring about cultural change. "It is our duty, the responsibility of each person, to give a voice to our voiceless sisters...It is necessary to act immediately, at all levels with determination, urgency and courage."

Globally 1 in 3 women subjected to physical or sexual abuse, with poverty, war and gender inequality all contributing. It is on our doorsteps too. In the UK one in four women and one in seven men are subjected to domestic abuse in their lifetime and a woman is killed every 5 days by a partner or ex-partner.


