## Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete)

### Fr. Jeremy writes...



Gaudete Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent, holds a special place in the liturgical calendar of the Christian Church. Its name, derived from the Latin word *gaudete*, meaning “rejoice,” comes from the opening antiphon of the Mass for that day: “Gaudete in Domino semper”, meaning “Rejoice in the Lord always” (Philippians 4:4). This day serves as a moment of joy and hope during the otherwise penitential season of Advent. Advent, a time of anticipation and preparation for the celebration of Christ’s birth at Christmas, traditionally carries a more reflective and sombre tone. However, on Gaudete Sunday, the Church invites the faithful to pause and rejoice, as the coming of Christ is drawing near. It is a reminder that, even in times of waiting or longing, there is reason to celebrate the promise of salvation.

On Gaudete Sunday, the liturgical colour shifts from purple, which symbolises penance, to rose. This change in colour reflects the joy and hope that is central to this day. It marks a moment of spiritual encouragement, urging believers to maintain their focus on the light and joy that will soon come with the birth of Jesus. In addition to the liturgical colour change, the themes of the readings on Gaudete Sunday focus on joy, hope, and the nearness of God’s kingdom with John the Baptist urging people to prepare for Christ’s coming with hearts full of anticipation.

Gaudete Sunday thus offers a moment of light in the midst of Advent’s season of waiting, encouraging Christians to rejoice in the certainty of Christ’s arrival and the salvation He brings. It is a reminder that even in the midst of hardship or longing, there is always cause for hope and joy in the Christian faith.

### New Lectionaries

Our new lectionaries are mandatory; we had to buy them, they are beautiful books as befits their sacred purpose, but they were expensive. Some parishioners have asked if they could contribute to their purchase and we have already received a generous gift of money towards them. If you would also like to contribute, there is a button on the Dona card reader in the narthex for this purpose, or you could pay by cheque made out to CDP Waterlooville Sacred Heart. Thanks you in advance for your help.

## Christmas Crib Offerings 2024



*Taken from Portsmouth Diocese's E-News...* In the Diocese, our annual Christmas Crib offerings are given alternately one year to the Friends of the Holy Land and one year to the Knights of the Holy Sepulchre. This year, 2024, our Christmas Crib offerings will go to the Knights of the Holy Sepulchre (KHS). The KHS is widely believed to date back to 1099 A.D., to the first crusade. For centuries their mission has been to support the Christian community in the Holy Land. Today, made up of 30,000

members from 40 countries, lay people, priests and religious, they financially support Christians in the Middle East, and, above all, pray for them. They fund many works that support the Christians living in the Holy Land, thus ensuring that they survive and that the holy sites are still populated by Christians and do not become museums. The Knights do everything they can to help with practical projects to stabilise Christian communities. The key partner for the KHS in the Holy Land is the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem and through the Patriarchate, they fund-raise to maintain schools, formation, charitable and social activities. The need to help this year is hugely urgent, thanks to the war in the Holy Land. Thank you in advance for your generosity!

The Baptist Church have kindly offered the use of their car park for both the 4pm and 8pm Masses, this will offer a quicker departure. Otherwise, please use the nearest town centre car parks or legal and considerate street parking on London Road feeders
- Double parking will be in operation in the church car park so a system of phased departure from the church will operate at the end of services. Please follow the directions for orderly leaving of the church and site
- Please seriously consider car sharing where possible

## Admittance to Hospital?

When a Catholic is admitted to hospital, the family should ensure that the Catholic Chaplaincy is contacted so that appropriate support can be given. It is suggested that the patient have a note to give to hospital staff on admission, notifying staff that they are Catholic and would appreciate the Catholic Chaplaincy service. This could be followed up by a telephone call from the family to the ward to ensure the request is actioned. When a person is due to go into hospital, please also let your parish priest know so that he can administer the Sacrament of the Sick where appropriate.

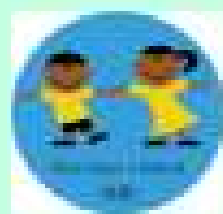

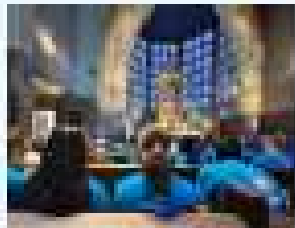
