

What is a Jubilee Year?

In the old Testament, a Jubilee year was held every fifty years. The year was a time of universal pardon where slaves were freed and debts were forgiven. The Jubilee was seen as an opportunity to re-establish relationship with God, with each other, and creation. It In 1300, Pope Boniface VIII instituted the first Christian Jubilee. Since its establishment the church has designated each Jubilee year as a special year of grace and forgiveness with the opportunity to receive a plenary indulgence.

The Jubilee year of 2025 is entitled "Pilgrims of Hope." At a time where many countries suffer from war, climate change, and financial hardship, Pope Francis hopes that the year ahead is an opportunity to restore hope, a time for renewal and rebirth. The year begins on the eve of Christmas, 2024, with the opening of the Holy Door in the basilica of St Peter's, Rome, and will close on the feast of Epiphany in 2026.

The Jubilee Year is also a great time to make pilgrimage. The following churches in our diocese have been designated as shrines: Sacred Heart, Bournemouth, St Edmund's, Southampton, St James Reading, St Thomas, Jersey and St Joseph's, Guernsey.

I hope the year ahead brings many blessing to both you and your family, the universal church and our diocese of Portsmouth.

Plenary Indulgences

Throughout a Jubilee year the church offers the faithful the possibility of receiving the gift of a plenary indulgence, a remission of temporal punishment due to sins applicable either to themselves or to those who have died. A Plenary indulgence is an opportunity for us to receive the mercy of the Lord, to draw closer to God and experience the joy of forgiveness.

In order to obtain a plenary indulgence, the following conditions must be fulfilled:

The penitent must visit one of the shrine churches, receive Sacramental confession and Holy Communion. They must also pray for the intentions of the pope and make a profession of faith by praying the creed. A plenary indulgence may be obtained once a day. At the same time, the pilgrim must exclude all attachment to sin, including venial sin. These conditions must all be completed within several days of the shrine visit.
