Sunday Reflection

THEME: BUILDING AUTHENTIC CHRISTIAN FAMILIES

Christmas has always been a family feast whether in Cameroon, England or anywhere on this planet earth. It is a time when families strive to come together and celebrate not only the joy of Christmas, but the joy of family life as well. This explains why those who live out of their homeland and families always endeavour to come back home during Christmas. Conscious of the family dimension of Christmas, the church has given us today the opportunity to celebrate family life. She wants us to do this by emulating the example of the Holy family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph; the holy family of Nazareth. The family as Christ restored to its original type is something holy, permanent and monogamous. In this light, He raised the contract from which it springs to the dignity of a sacrament, and thus placed the family itself upon the plane of the supernatural. So today gives us the opportunity to augment what we cannot celebrate very well in our individual Christian families.

The family is the smallest but the most basic and important society. The Christian family is supernatural insomuch as it originates in a sacrament. The ideals of a Christian family have always been proven to be more than those of a non-Christian family. The Christian family, as a small community both shows itself as a great human community in the divine plan and reflects the Church which is a bigger family. Unfortunately, this ideal Christian family is plagued by so many challenges today. It is in this light that the Holy Father, Pope Francis had to say: "There is no perfect family. We do not have perfect parents, we are not perfect, we do not marry a perfect person or have perfect children. We have complaints about each other. We disappoint each other". In the face of these imperfect families of ours, we need the example of the holy family of Nazareth, to stand as a light in the darkened sides of our families.

From the above, we realize that we all have a duty to work towards building our families to be better places for ourselves, spouse, children, relatives and friends. The readings of today encourage us in that dimension. That is why the first reading pointed out the duties of all the family members. We must note that the wife is neither the slave nor the property of her husband, but his companion. The children are not articles to be bought and sold or disposed of at will through free choice. Children and all members of a family have their distinctive parts to play to make the family a beautiful and peaceful place. When everyone plays his or her part well, the family becomes like the members of a choir with everyone singing his/her own part thereby bringing good musical harmony.

To build that harmony in a family and for the family to function well, the readings of today provide us with valuable help. The first reading calls children to respect and the obedience and honour of parents. It goes ahead to call them to support their parents in their old age and I will dare to add always. These are values both spouses and children need. The second reading adds love, compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience as essential virtues to work on in every family. It goes ahead to emphasise the value of forgiveness. Stressing on forgiveness, I will add what the holy Father Francis said:

So, there is no healthy marriage or healthy family without the exercise of forgiveness. Forgiveness is vital to our emotional health and spiritual survival. Without forgiveness the family becomes an arena of conflict and a stronghold of hurt. Without forgiveness, the family becomes ill. Forgiveness is the asepsis of the soul, the cleansing of the mind and the liberation of the heart. Whoever does not forgive does not have peace in the soul nor communion with God. Hurt is poison that intoxicates and kills. Keeping heartache in the heart is a selfdestructive gesture. It's autophagy. Those who do not forgive are physically, emotionally and spiritually ill. That is why the family must be a place of life, not of death; Territory of cure and not of illness; Stage of forgiveness and not guilt. Forgiveness brings joy where sorrow has produced sadness; Healing, where sorrow has caused disease.

But these virtues are not gotten from watching TV or playing games or reading about them from books. They need hard work and perseverance. That is why St. Paul calls us to teach and advise each other in all wisdom; doing so with gratitude in our hearts. By this, our spouse and children shall come to know God, listen to his words and follow his teachings. As we celebrate this day, let us ask the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph to help us work towards building true Christian families where love, care and respect reigns supreme.
