The Epiphany of the Lord (Year C, Cycle 1)

5th January 2025

"Guided by the Star of Christ"

Is. 60: 1-6; Ps: 71: 1-2.7-13; Eph. 3: 2-3.5-6; Mt. 2: 1-12

Today we celebrate the solemnity of Epiphany, and in a most special way the day of the three kings who brought Jesus the very costly and symbolic gifts of Gold, frankincense and Myrrh, three gifts which signify Jesus' kingship, priesthood and prophetic mission respectively. Epiphany is of Greek origin, epiphaninen. It is a verb which means "to reveal," or "to manifest". It celebrates the many ways through which Jesus has revealed himself to us and our world. These include the three events that bring to light his mission and divinity: the visitation of the three kings or Magi (Mt. 2: 10-12), the baptism of Jesus (Mk. 1: 9-11), and the miracle at Cana (Jn. 2: 1-11). We can also add here the Transfiguration of the Lord (Mt. 17:1-8).

In these events, God reveals himself to us and make known His mission for mankind. Through the star, God guides the Magi to the manger, a journey which we can walk with the Magi as signifying our discipleship from our baptism through to life in Christ guided by His light. The light that shines forth upon us today is the light of life from which we ourselves must get our own light and reflect it unto others. So as the Lord's star guided the Magi, so too it guides us and makes us into others stars to show the way to our neighbours that they may also meet Christ.

Today the Lord Jesus Christ further extends and expands the horizon of his love to us by not being selfish. He allows himself to illumine the darkness of our lives. The lesson in all of these is that we must also make our lives better and allow the goodness that flows from us help others. We must brighten our light so that others can see with it as Christ illumines our way and life this New Year with his own light, life, divine presences and counsel.

The gospel of today from Matthew is about the visitation of the three wise kings. They came to adore and offer gifts to the new born king, Jesus Christ. This gospel is full of many lessons for us to learn. First, guided by the star, the three kings came to offer Christ a genuine worship as the King of kings. Although they were kings in their own stead, they nevertheless acknowledge the supremacy of the Lord. This points to our dependence on God who is all powerful.

Second, along the way they were guided by the star but when they entered Herod's palace, a symbol of darkness and sin, the star disappeared. This is how our journey to Christ unfolds. In virtue, we have Christ's light for our guide and in sin, that light disappears. But the voice of God (CCC 27) does not stop echoing in our hearts calling us to conversion as it did the Prodigal son. This is why when the Magi left the sinful palace and embarked once more on the journey, the star, God's light, reappeared.

Third, we must be ready to offer Jesus something. We must not appear before the Lord empty handed. The Magi presented gifts of Gold, frankincense and Myrrh. We may not have like to present, but we have so many other gifts which the Lords expects of us. We must ask ourselves today, what do I offer the Lord for his goodness to me? We can ourselves, the gift of good life, the gift of love, the gift of obedience, the gift of humility, the gift of peace to our families and world, and the gift of sacrifice for one another, the gift of forgiveness. Why not be generous to others as the three wise kings did to Jesus?

"The car park on commercial road is used by parishioners at Christ the King & St Colman on Sunday mornings, almost exclusively, and has been for many years.

This church serves Bitterne, Sholing, Thornhill, Midanbury and Hightown and so travel by car is essential for many of our parishioners, particularly elderly and families.

This restriction would increase street parking in the local area, and have a negative impact on the local community both within and outside of the church.

We would ask that you reconsider this restriction, especially for Sundays. We have masses in our church from late morning until late evening."
