Sunday Reflection

THEME: THE LORD TAKES DELIGHT IN YOU

Last week we celebrated the feast of the Baptism of the lord which ended our Christmas celebrations delight, marked the beginning of the first period of the season of ordinary time. Today, we continue with the second Sunday of O.T. Year C. As we celebrate this day, I would like us to reflect on the theme: "The Lord takes delight in you".

These are the words we find in the first reading of today in which the Lord, through the prophet Isaiah, is assuring the Israelites of his constant care and concern for them though their disobedience had led them into exile. The Lord takes delight in his people and rejoices over them like a bridegroom rejoices over her bride. To take delight in something will mean to admire, to appreciate, go for, adore, love, cherish, esteem, prize or take pleasure in something. It has to do with care and concern for something that we love and cherish. We will do everything to defend and safeguard that thing or person. And that is exactly what the Lord does for us despite our unfaithfulness to him.

Despite the sins of the Israelites that had led them into the Babylonian captivity, the Lord did not abandon them. He loved them still. The purpose of this is that God does not want anyone to die in sin. He strives to bring us closer to him every day. In this light, he will not be silent or weary to help us until our integrity shines out like the dawn and our salvation flames like a torch. God takes delight in us because he wants nations and kings to see our integrity. We are a crown of splendour in the hand of the Lord, a princely diadem in God's hand. In this way, we shall never be named "Forsaken" or our land "Abandoned" but we shall be God's delight, and he shall rejoice over us as a young man marrying a virgin, something rear today.

The first reading is an assurance for us that no matter what is happening to us, whether sickness, poverty, miscarriage, broken marriage, trouble at workplace, etc, God takes delight in you and is willing to set us free. He is willing to take care of every distressing situation or pain, embarrassments, etc we might have experienced or are experiencing now. We only need to get to him and his mother, Mary, and they will help you out.

The above is brought out in the gospel of today. At the wedding feast of Cana, the couple ran out of wine. What a disgrace and shame this would have brought on them; that they didn't have enough wine to entertain their guests. Think of your experiences of weddings or other occasions. How do you feel when you go and there isn't enough food or drink; especially when you had prepared yourself for much eating and drinking? Mary didn't want these couples to be embarrassed in such a situation. She took delight in the couple and went to ask her son to help. He did and they had more than enough wine from water. This is recorded as the first miracle in Jesus' public ministry.

As members of the body of Christ, the Church, Jesus and Mary are teaching us to take delight in others and always see how to make them happy. That is why the apostle Paul, writing to the church at Corinth, in today's second reading tells us that God has given gifts to the church to be used at the service of all. These gifts include: preaching with wisdom, gift of preaching with instruction, faith, power to perform miracles, healing, discernment of spirits, tongues and interpretation of tongues. All these different charismatic gifts are present in the Church given by the same Spirit. These are the gifts received by the disciples of Jesus on Pentecost and these gifts have been present in the Church since then. But these are not the only gifts available for us from the Spirit. Others include: love, hospitality, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, fortitude, fear of the Lord, prayers, etc.

We need to examine ourselves today: that as the Lord has taken delight in me and lavishly bestowed on me his gifts, how am I using these for the good of others? Do I have concern too for others? May we be challenged today to be hospitable to others and show concern for others too especially in their distress.
