Jubilee Year of Hope



As many of you will know, Pope Francis inaugurated 2025 as a Jubilee Year of Hope when he opened the Holy Door of St Peter's Basilica in Rome on Christmas Eve. The word jubilee derives from the Hebrew, 'Jobel', which means 'a ram's horn.' The instrument would be blown indicating the start of the year.

For the Israelites, the number seven was the perfect or heavenly number, and every seven years Israelites were encouraged to forgive debts, mend family quarrels, return items taken as pledges, and so on. Every seven x seven years (i.e., 49 years) was an extra special Jubilee Year, and this was rounded up to fifty years for convenience. Additionally in a fiftieth Jubilee Year, any land that had been sequestered from others had to be returned, slaves set free, and land allowed to lie fallow of crops for the year to recover its strength. It was a time to re-establish relationship with God, with each other, and creation.

The Christian Church adopted the practice of the Jubilee Year in 1300 when Pope Boniface VIII introduced the first jubilee, also known as a holy year, to mark the beginning of that century. Christians were invited to come in pilgrimage to Rome and to pray at the tombs of the apostles in order to receive the full remission of their sins (a plenary indulgence) Pope Boniface recommended that a jubilee year take place every hundred years. Later popes changed the intervals between years, and jubilees are now celebrated every 25 years, although sometimes a pope may add an additional "extraordinary" year, such as the 2016 'Year of Mercy.'

While pilgrimages to Rome are encouraged during a Holy Year, each diocese selects a number of specially designated churches to provide the opportunity to obtain the Jubilee Indulgence. 
