"Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing"

Today" is the first word of Jesus 'public teaching. It's not about what happened yesterday or what might happen tomorrow. It is about today. "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing". We too often miss today fretting over yesterday and worrying about tomorrow and yet the presence of Christ today somehow heals our past and prepares us for the future. Good news, release, sight, freedom, the Lord's favour. All these are made real and present today, in the current context and circumstances of our lives. Those are not just things Jesus does, they are the manifestation of God's presence, life, and love with and in God's people. They are manifestations of the freedom Christ brings. They are fulfilled, brought to fullness, in our hearing. To the extent we are unable to hear Jesus 'words we are either stuck in the past or living in a future we do not yet have. Hearing is about more than sound. It is about our presence, openness, and receptivity. We must be willing to take into ourselves the reality and truth of what is spoken. We must also be willing to take into ourselves the life and presence of the one who is speaking. Jesus is not just speaking words. He is speaking new life. In his speaking and our hearing his life and our life become one life and it is happening today.

Second collection This Weekend: St John's Cathedral (mandatory)

A second collection will take place at all Masses on 25/26 January.

Canon James McAuley, Cathedral Dean, Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia, has written the following to highlight the annual Second Collection for the Cathedral, Mother Church of the Diocese...

Since I became Dean of our Cathedral Church of St John the Evangelist in September 2022, the parish has had to pay for the emergency repair of three serious roof leaks, as well as the replacement of two failing flat roofs. The cost of these repairs was met from parish funds. In 2023, the 120-year-old West Window had to be shored up, removed and completely restored to prevent its imminent collapse. So far, generous donors from the parish and from across the diocese have contributed £84,130 of the £90,100 cost of repair.

Our most recent quinquennial architectural survey (autumn 2023) indicated work required over the next few years to the roof, windows, heating, and electrical systems at an estimated cost of £2 million plus VAT.

I fully appreciate the financial pressures being felt by you and by your parishioners but would appeal to you to promote and support the Second Collection for the Cathedral on 26th January. Never has this annual collection by parishes for the Mother Church of the Diocese been more critical or needed. Your support is vitally important to us.

News from St. Peter's School

Pupils in Year 5 at St Peter's are really extending their physical activity this term. Each class is taking part in a six-week swimming programme between the New Year and Easter, with weekly hour-long lessons at the Waterlooville Horizon Leisure Centre. These classes cater for children of all swimming abilities and levels of water confidence, with the target of all pupils achieving a swimming distance of 25m in various strokes, treading water, floating on their backs and getting themselves out of deep water unaided. Added to this, the Year 5 classes will also be enjoying Bikeability sessions - that's the updated name for Cycling Proficiency. As well as learning basic cycle care and cycling skills, the children will also take to the roads around school to learn how to navigate public highways safely and correctly. Both of these activities are proof against the claim that young people are just on sofas and on screens the whole time and show that the St Peter's curriculum extends to valuable life skills and enriching physical activities.

Safeguarding Training in Person on Saturday 8 February

Julie Minal, the Safeguarding Training Officer will be running a session at St. Swithun's, Southsea on Saturday 8 February:

There are basically two sessions. The first is child protection starting at 11am and finishing at 12.30. We then have half an hour for lunch and the second session of working with adults at risk starts at 1.00pm and with a mid-way short comfort break, finishes by 4pm.

Admittance to Hospital?

When a Catholic is admitted to hospital, the family should ensure that the Catholic Chaplaincy is contacted so that appropriate support can be given. It is suggested that the patient have a note to give to hospital staff on admission, notifying staff that they are Catholic and would appreciate the Catholic Chaplaincy service. This could be followed up by a telephone call from the family to the ward to ensure the request is actioned. When a person is due to go into hospital, please also let your parish priest know so that he can administer the Sacrament of the Sick where appropriate.

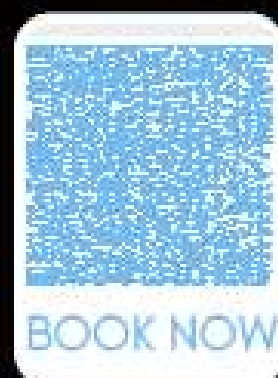
