Sunday Reflection

THEME: GOD'S FAVOUR IS UPON YOU

Today is the fourth Sunday in O.T. Year C. But we have been given the opportunity to celebrate the feast of the presentation of the child Jesus in the Temple. The presentation of the Lord, also known as 'Candlemas', traditionally concludes celebration of Christmas. It commemorates the presentation of Jesus in the Temple forty days after his birth, an occasion where offerings were made, and the mother was ritually purified. The day gives us the opportunity to close the Christmas Festival of Light. That is why candles are blessed at the beginning of mass and carried in procession. The feast is in line with the Jewish tradition of dedication of the firstborn son prescribed in Ex 13:2, 11. As we celebrate the feast, the readings want us to reflect on the fact that God's favour is not only on Christ but is also on us.

In the gospel, we are told that the parents of Jesus brought the child to the Temple and offered him up alongside two turtledoves. Within the context of this dedication, two key figures appear whose virtuous lives gave them the privilege to see the promised Messiah before they leave this world. But what is interesting is that after the dedication of the child, they returned to Galilee, to their own city, Nazareth and there the child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him. We can see how he made use of this favour in his life through his public ministry of preaching, healings, miracles, leadership, etc.

We also are favoured by the Lord in so many ways. First, we are told in the Book of Genesis that man was created in the image and likeness of God. This is the greatest favour God has done for us. Apart from this, He keeps favouring us every day,

by the blessings He bestows on each of us each day. Just look at where you are today and compare this with where you were 10 years ago. Many of us, if we are not blind to the blessings God has granted us, can count so many blessings that God has granted us. There are many things we thought we could not do or overcome but God's favour brought us this far.

God's favour will always continue to be with us. It is doubled when we strive to live in accord with His will. It's an opportunity for us to ask how far we have been faithful to keeping God's laws, as a way of saying thank you Lord, for the many favours you have granted me? God loves you. His favour is on you. Do not disregard this by doubts or sin.

Happy feast of the presentation to you all, as we present ourselves to receive God's favour today.

ST. JOSEPH: Adoration at 8:30 am followed by Mass at 9:30 am in English on Thursdays. On Saturdays 5 pm adoration followed by 6 pm mass and 9 am mass on Sundays.

The Church will be open from 11 am - 1:30 pm Monday to Friday. (Most days there will also be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Adoration in the morning).

The Church will also be open for Holy Hour from 7pm - 8pm Monday to Friday, during which there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and friars will be praying Vespers (in Latin) and the Rosary. Then the Holy Hour concludes with Benediction.

(If a friar is not going to be in the Church while it is open, we will lock the Sacristy door while the Church remains open).
