## **Sunday Reflection**

## THEME: WE SAW HIS STAR AND HAVE COME TO DO HIM HOMAGE

The Christmas season normally ends with the Baptism of the Lord which shall take place next Sunday. But before we crown the Christmas season, the Church has given to us the privilege of celebrating the Epiphany of the Lord. Epiphany has to do with the manifestation of Jesus Christ as light to the darkness of this world. That is why Isaiah says in the first reading: "Arise, shine out Jerusalem, for your light has come, the glory of the Lord is rising on you, though night still covers the earth and darkness the peoples. Above you the Lord now rises and above you his glory appears. Nations will come to the light and kings to your dawning darkness" (Is 60:1-3).

But how could men have realized this light and how could they have known he is the one? The gospel answers these questions vividly: they saw his star and have come to pay him homage. Jesus had been born in Bethlehem and an angel appeared to shepherds to announce his birth. These are pagans who are considered by the Jews as one of those who cannot enter heaven by the Jews but God sends his Angel to announce the birth of the Light to them. The Light came to bring men out of darkness. The shepherds saw the star which guided them to the Light and when they saw the Light that has come to illumine the darkness of this world, they went down on their knees and worshipped him offering gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

The journey of the shepherds guided by a star to go and worship the king is the journey of everyone here on earth, whether pagans or Christians or members of other religions. Christ came for all and not only for Christians. Therefore, we all need to leave the darkness of earthly life and allow ourselves to be directed by a star to go and worship Christ now and for ever. The unfortunate thing is that many of us have different stars we follow: music stars, football stars, film stars,

etc. But we need a more powerful and meaningful star in order to go and worship Christ. This more important star constitutes two things: the Bible and the Church. We need these two if we must journey to worship the Light, Jesus Christ. As we journey, sometimes the star might be dim or disappear on the way as it did with the shepherds and we find ourselves in the wrong place: Herod's palace. Never remain there. This happens when we find the sins of some members of the church especially the elders or your own sins and we think the star no longer shines, or that the Church is no longer a star to guide us. The star will always shine to guide us to pay homage but we do sometimes cut off ourselves from the star and take the wrong road. The star is not an individual or group(s) of individuals but the Church that shows Christ to the world despite the sinfulness of individual members.

As we celebrate the Epiphany, let us make a firm resolution to follow the star, Scriptures and the Church, to go and pay homage to the Light, Jesus Christ. This should be reflected in an authentic Christian life.
