8th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C, Cycle 1)

2nd March 2025

"Goodness and Beauty – Virtues of the Heart"

Sirach 27:4-7 1 Corinthians 15:54-58 Luke 6:39-45

On this 8th Sunday of the Ordinary Time, Year C, the church is reminding us of the values and characteristics that should define our life as followers of Christ. The Church exhorts us that physical reality might be misleading. Thus, our personalities are what define who we are. This encompasses the calibre of our speech, the knowledge, and the virtue we exhibit.

Therefore, today's first reading advises us from judging people by their outward look rather than their inherent qualities. It says: "The test of a man is in his conversation. A man's word betrays what he feels. Do not praise him before he speaks." Despite this, it suffices to note that one needs a lot of wisdom to discern the truth in someone's word. This is true, especially given that many people say beautiful words to please and deceive others while their hearts are far from the truth.

Christ says: These people honour me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me" (Mt. 15:8). Sometimes, they also tell us what we want to hear to make us happy for a moment and sad afterward. The wisdom, good counsel, and sincerity that come from the word of a Christ's disciple is what sets him/her apart. It makes him/her: "A man or woman, in whom there is no guile or deceit" (John 1:47). Not only our words but our actions as Christian must edify, improve and encourage, others.

So, today we must ask ourselves, do my words edify or make any positive difference to others? Does it build or destroy the community?

In today's gospel, Jesus also teaches us that the quality of our heart determines the quality of our

words and actions. He says, "A good person, out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good, while an evil person, out of a store of evil produces evil; for from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks."

As disciples of Christ, if we live according to the good news, our actions and words would be guided by it. Consequently, it will affect others positively. On the contrary, if we fill our hearts with flirtation, our words and actions would be filled with nothingness.

In the second reading, Paul reminds us that God has given us victory through Christ. For this reason, we must be of good cheers and never relent in doing good. Christ's victory must not be in vain. Instead, it must sustain us in good actions as Paul tells us today: "Keep labouring at the Lord's work always, knowing that, in the Lord, you cannot be struggling in vain. This is a call to perfection in all we say and do.

Finally, today, may our hearts be filled with joy for what God has down for us through Christ. Through Him, we are filled with goodness so that we can praise and thank God with a cheerful and sincere heart. Indeed, it is good to give thanks to the Lord for what he has done for us.
