Sunday Reflection

THEME: TREAT OTHERS AS YOU WOULD LIKE THEM TO TREAT YOU

The tendency I have noticed in life; with myself and with others, is that for most of us, we want to be treated well and also with respect but invariably fail to do the same for others. We will want others to offer us the best of their time, services, attention, etc., but can't stick out to do the same. Jesus in today's gospel invites us to learn to treat others as we would love to be treated.

The above exhortation from Jesus in Luke's gospel is also found in the Book of Tobit and the Book of Deuteronomy. It's very important for our relationship we should treat others the way we would love to be treated or put in the negative, we should not do to anyone that which we would not want to be done to us. In other words, we can simply say Jesus wants us to treat others as we treat ourselves or love others as we love ourselves. He does this within the context of Luke's version of the beatitudes which he started last week. If we are to do this, then we must have no enemies but love those who hate us. We must offer the other cheek to the man who slaps us. We must give to everyone who asks something from us, etc.

When we look at today's reflection, we must create time to ask ourselves: how do I want to be treated? When one has properly answered this question, then go ahead to treat others in that same light. I would like people to speak well about me. That people should judge me fairly; they should not gossip about me, they should be kind enough to tell me what I have done wrong. Also, I would want to eat the best food; have the best company; want people to pay greater attention to my needs; to be happy, etc. Jesus wants me to transfer all these to the way I deal with others. This is very important especially because we carry along with us several biases which prevent us from realizing this. One thing I have noticed in my life is that I like to condemn others wrongly or gossip about them, but will not want to tolerate that when it happens to me. I follow the social psychological concept of "fundamental attribution error" where I judge the actions of others in term of bad upbringing or character and when it comes to me, with the same actions, I favour myself and judge it in terms of situation.

We all need to rise from our biases and treat others fairly. If we can do this well, the world would be a better place to live in because we shall always wish the good of others and work towards that. May this be our determination and prayer throughout the week.

CONTINUATION OF ANNOUNCEMENTS

PARISH FINANCES: Could you heat your house for £1 a week? Probably not, so think about the size of the churches and how much it costs to heat them so that you are warm when you attend Mass. Because St. Joseph's has not been open for two years, we have no bills for comparison, but two years ago, before we were shut down, the bill was more than £900 for three months for St. Joseph's and over £900 a month for Corpus Christi plus approx £1,400 in standing orders - the weekly collection for both churches is in the region of £300 or less. We'll leave you to do the sums, but the income is nothing like the expenditure (and that is only for the gas, let alone everything else!). We all know that gas and electricity prices have rocketed recently so we are expecting a hefty bill in March.

We are coming to the time of year when we give out Gift Aid envelopes for the next 12 months. This year, we are not only appealing for people to consider taking out a standing order instead of envelopes, but for those people who already have standing orders, to increase them. Many of you will have been in the scheme for years and never increased the amount you give. Could you give another £5 a month or more perhaps? Every little helps.

JUBILEE PLANNING MEETING OUTCOME

On Monday 3rd Feb. 2025 at SJ church at 7pm, we had a meeting to plan the parish activities during this jubilee year, Pilgrims of Hope. At the end of the meeting, the following was decided:The Jubilee prayer and the prayer of hope will be printed and laminated and used for prayers in our churches throughout the jubilee year.

- 1. First Friday adoration to be done in our parish churches after masses from 10am to 6pm. Parishioners encouraged to sign up for adoration time slots.
- 9th March 2025 (First Sunday of Lent) will be the launching of the Jubilee year in our parish.
- Parish Jubilee celebration at the cathedral shall surely be on Ascension Thursday (29th May 2025). Necessary arrangements towards this shall be made and concrete programme communicated later by parish
