Seeing God's Glory in Our Lives

The 2nd Sunday of Lent Year C reminds us that God's glory is always present in our lives. Sometimes we are too attached to our own expectations to see it. We might be too set in our ways, unwilling to let God change us. But God's glory shines through when we let go and let Him work in us.

We often miss God's glory because we are focused on ourselves. We want to project a certain image to the world. But this blocks others from seeing God's work in us. The readings teach us to have faith in God's promises, like Abraham did. When God told him his descendants would be as numerous as the stars, Abraham believed even though he couldn't see it.

The Gospel calls us to let go of our own plans. We need to trust God's vision for our lives. Abraham's faith is an example for us. He believed in God's promises even when it seemed impossible. We are called to have the same faith.

As we reflect on these readings, we are reminded to look for God's glory in everyday life. It might be in small acts of kindness or moments of peace. When we open our hearts to God, His glory shines through us. We need to let go of our own image and let God's light be seen.

Applying this to our lives means being open to change. It means trusting God's plan and believing in His promises. On the 2nd Sunday of Lent Year C, let us commit to letting God's glory shine through us. This Lent, may we grow in faith and openness to God's work in our lives.

Sacred Heart Lent Programme 2025

Lent is a season in the Church's calendar when we're invited, for 40 days, to find time for prayer and fasting. It's an opportunity for spiritual growth as we prepare to commemorate the suffering and death of Jesus Christ and the celebration of his resurrection at Easter. These 6 weeks mirror the amount of time that Jesus spent in the desert to fast and pray.

At Sunday Mass the following differences are observed to mark the change of season:

- the entrance procession is silent
- we kneel for the Penitential Rite
- the penitential rite is the triple trope formula
- there is no Gloria
- there are no Alleluias
- the Mass prayers are recited on a monotone
- the Apostles' Creed substitutes the usual Nicene Creed
- one of the Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation is used
- We use the English Plainchant settings from the Missal for the Holy, holy and Lamb of God
- there is an extra Prayer Over the People after Communion.

There are **no floral arrangements** as it is a penitential season.

There are **no Baptisms** as it is a season of preparation for Baptism.

Fr. Jeremy and Fr. James will be celebrating an extra **Mass at 7.30am** Monday to Friday excluding Tuesday (*please check newsletter on a weekly basis*). *If you would like to book a Mass for a loved one, occasion, private intention or thanksgiving during this time please contact Lisa at the Presbytery to arrange.* Mass Offering envelopes can be found in the narthex.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Saturdays of Lent @ 5pm

The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man. The 14 devotions, or stations, focus on specific events of His last day, beginning with His condemnation.


The stations are commonly used as a mini pilgrimage as the individual moves from station to station. At each station, the individual recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day. Specific prayers are recited, then the individual moves to the next station until all 14 are complete.




News from St. Peter's School...

Richard Cunningham, Headteacher writes...

Recently, we celebrated diversity week at St Peter's and in Year 3 we were focusing on how other faiths pray. We spoke about how and where people of both the Jewish and Hindu faiths prayed, as well as who to whom they pray. As part of our learning about Hinduism we created our own Mendhi hands really focusing on the fine details.

Meanwhile in Year 5 science, we made predictions on what time in the day our shadow would be at its longest, and when it would be at its shortest. We then created a prediction graph to show how long we thought our shadow would be at different points in the day. Throughout the day, we then went onto the playground and measured our shadows to find out if our predictions were correct.

When a Catholic is admitted to hospital, the family should ensure that the Catholic Chaplaincy is contacted so that appropriate support can be given. It is suggested that the patient have a note to give to hospital staff on admission, notifying staff that they are Catholic and would appreciate the Catholic Chaplaincy service. This could be followed up by a telephone call from the family to the ward to ensure the request is actioned. When a person is due to go into hospital, please also let your parish priest know so that he can administer the Sacrament of the Sick where appropriate.

• Certificate in Catechesis

JUBILEE OF VOLUNTEERS

As part of the Jubilee Year, the Jubilee of Volunteers is being celebrated on **8th - 9th March**. Pope Francis said of volunteers that *"Your presence is the hand of Christ held out to all, and reaching all."*

For the Jubilee of Volunteers in the Year of Mercy Pope Francis addressed those in St Peter's Square saying *"Brothers and sisters, you represent the large and varied world of voluntary workers. You are among the most precious things the Church has, you who every day, often silently and unassumingly, give shape and visibility to mercy. You express one of the most noble desires of the human heart, making a suffering person feel loved. In the different contexts of need of so many people, your presence is the hand of Christ held out to all, and reaching all. The credibility of the Church is also conveyed in a convincing way through your service to abandoned children, to the sick, the poor who lack food or work, to the elderly, the homeless, prisoners, refugees and immigrants, to all struck by natural disasters... Indeed, wherever there is a cry for help, there your active and selfless witness is found. In bearing one another's burdens, you make Christ's law visible (cf. Gal 6:2; Jn 13:34). Be always ready to offer solidarity, to be steadfast in your closeness to others, determined in awakening joy and genuine in giving comfort. The world stands in need of concrete signs of solidarity, especially as it is faced with the temptation to indifference. It requires persons who, by their lives, defy such individualism, which is the tendency to think only of oneself and to ignore the brother or sister in need."*

Our churches have volunteers fulfilling so many different roles, from the ministries of reading, catechesis, distributing Holy Communion, flower arranging, cleaning, helping with administration, sitting on committees, visiting the sick and helping those made poor. Volunteering can deepen your relationship with Jesus and evangelise through presence and relationship.

In Brazil, Pope Francis said of the volunteers *"This is the most beautiful service we can give as missionary disciples. To prepare the way so that all people may know, meet and love the Lord. May you always be generous with God and with others: one loses nothing thereby, but gains great enrichment in life."*




