

# Sunday Reflection

#### THEME: REPENT OR YOU SHALL PERISH

We are entering the third week of lent where the Lenten message is coming to us forcibly in a new way. Lent is a time when we are invited to experience in a special way the mercy of God. We are called during this time to repentance and the readings have been encouraging us towards this since we started this grace filled season. As we begin the third week, the readings continue the same message of repentance but this time with a threat from Christ: repent or you will all perish. I am afraid, if we do not repent from our evil ways, we shall indeed all perish.

In the gospel of today, we find some people who have come to report to Jesus about some misfortune that had fallen upon the land. They told Jesus of some Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with the blood of their sacrifices. Probably, Pilate met them offering sacrifices which he did not want and so decided to kill them and add them to their sacrifices. What a pity! But my concern is: why were they telling Jesus this story? Was it to provoked him or really to learn? Whatever their motivating reason, Jesus' response brings us to the reality of what we are called to do otherwise we face the effects.

In response to their story, Christ says: "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way, they were greater sinners than all the other Galileans? By no means. But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did." To substantiate further, Jesus quotes an old unfortunate incident that had taken place at that time by asking: those 18 persons killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them, were they more guilty than the others in Jerusalem? By no means. Christ then goes further to warn the second time: if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, despite my sinfulness, I don't want to perish. I long for repentance but fail to live up to the task. This notwithstanding, I am making the effort each day not to perish. We all need to do same. We are all sinners in need of God's mercy. God's mercy which we celebrate during the Year of mercy some years ago and at this time of Pilgrims of Hope, is always present in the sacrament of reconciliation and at mass. The penitential liturgy at mass opens us to God's mercy, so that we may not perish but have eternal life. We must not then continue to live in sin when God is calling us to repentance.

The way of repentance is the way all of us should take. It is a sure but difficult way to Christ. Without repentance we are all lost. We should all make the effort to repent despite the challenges involve. When we fall on this way of repentance, we should not relent but rise again in the sacrament of Reconciliation. The saints in the Church and the holy people we have encountered, especially those who grew out of sinfulness to holiness are examples we can emulate today. Think for example saints like St. Paul, St. Ignatius, St. Mary Magdalen, St. Peter, etc. They made a personal journey of repentance to holiness.

May God help us on this task of repentance to be true to his name otherwise we perish.

## CONTINUATION OF ANNOUNCEMENTS

**PARISH FINANCES**: Could you heat your house for £1 a week? Probably not, so think about the size of the churches and how much it costs to heat them so that you are warm when you attend Mass. Because St. Joseph's has not been open for two years, we have no bills for comparison, but two years ago, before we were shut down, the bill was more than £900 for three months for St. Joseph's and over £900 a month for Corpus Christi plus approx £1,400 in standing orders – the weekly collection for both churches is in the region of £300 or less. We'll leave you to do the sums, but the income is nothing like the expenditure (and that is only for the gas, let alone everything else!). We all know that gas and electricity prices have rocketed recently so we are expecting a hefty bill in March.

We are coming to the time of year when we give out Gift Aid envelopes for the next 12 months. This year, we are not only appealing for people to consider taking out a standing order instead of envelopes, but for those people who already have standing orders, to increase them. Many of you will have been in the scheme for years and never increased the amount you give. Could you give another £5 a month or more perhaps? Every little helps.

**CONTACTLESS PAYMENT IN THE PARISH**: As part of the future parish, we are being encouraged to sign up for the Dona contactless payment scheme, which will be operational in all the churches of our new parish. The arrangements for this have already been made and by next month, God willing, the contactless payment scheme will be operational in the parish. We would be able to use this scheme to pay for votive candles, offerings, mass intentions, stole fees, donations, etc.

**GIFT AID ENVELOPES AND TALK:** Thank you to those who listened to the talk about Parish finances and how Gift Aid can help. We will be available this weekend to sign up any new members or increase standing orders for others. Please consider your giving and how much it costs to heat the church, for instance, November & December was almost £1,500. Income from Standing orders for February was £1,344, so not enough to pay the heating bill, let alone anything else.

There will be a talk at Corpus Christi Church today explaining why it is so important to give by Gift Aid.

**PARISH RETREAT**: This will be in Dominican Sisters, Sway, on Saturday, 29th March from 10 am to 4 pm. We look forward to car sharing and ask those who want to help out to let Fr Emmanuel know.

#### JUBILEE PLANNING MEETING OUTCOME

On Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> Feb. 2025 at SJ church at 7pm, we had a meeting to plan the parish activities during this jubilee year, Pilgrims of Hope. At the end of the meeting, the following was decided: The Jubilee prayer and the prayer of hope will be printed and laminated and used for prayers in our churches throughout the jubilee year.

- 1. First Friday adoration to be done in our parish churches after masses from 10am to 6pm. Parishioners encouraged to sign up for adoration time slots.
- 9<sup>th</sup> March 2025 (First Sunday of Lent) will be the launching of the Jubilee year in our parish.
- Parish Jubilee celebration at the cathedral shall surely be on Ascension Thursday (29<sup>th</sup> May 2025). Necessary arrangements towards this shall be made and concrete programme communicated later by parish
- Jubilee retreat: Will take place on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> March 2025 at the Dominican Sisters in Sway from 10 am to 4 pm. Parishioners are encouraged to sign up.
- 5. Jubilee pilgrimage shall take place in October and either Walsingham or Ladywell will be our pilgrimage site.
- 6. Jubilee faith in action plan. We are all encouraged to put into practice our corporal works of mercy; to feed the hungry, visit the sick, give drink to the thirty, clothe the naked, etc.
- 7. Closing of the jubilee year in Advent 2025

**LAUNCHING OF JUBILEE YEAR:** Jubilee prayer and the prayer of hope bookmark will be said after every mass throughout the jubilee year.
