Sunday Reflection

THEME: ANYONE WHO IS CHRIST IS A NEW CREATION

Every fourth Sunday of Lent is celebrated as "Laetare Sunday." This is because of the first word of the entrance antiphon of today's liturgy. Laetare means Rejoice, and so the entrance antiphon reads: "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast" (Is 66:10-11). This joy is always resonated every third Sunday of Advent also when we celebrate Gaudete Sunday. As we celebrate this day, I would like us to reflect on the fact that anyone who is Christ is a new creation.

The above theme is beautifully crafted in the second reading of today when St. Paul in his second letter to the church at Corinthian wrote: "For anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new is here. It is all God's work" (2 Cor 5:17). For us to be a new creation in Christ and live that out worthily, demands an understanding of the old creation.

The old creation here refers to man in his fallen state and the resulting concupiscence. This presents the old creation to us, firstly, as a life of sinfulness which each and every one of us must work on daily. We find this in the fall of our first parents and in our own sins. It is reflected in the sins of the younger son in today's gospel passage, the parable of the prodigal son. The prodigal son got tired of waiting for his father to die so he can have his own share of the inheritance. Courageous enough, he approached his father to ask for his own share of inheritance that he would receive from his father, at the moment of his death. His father being too generous, understanding and kindhearted, gave him everything he had to give him. The son sold everything and few days after left for a strange land, for a life of sin: drunkenness, orgies, sexual pleasure, useless living etc., all in the name of enjoying life. We too may not be different from him. When we leave God and concentrate on ourselves, we are not different from the prodigal son. We become members of a strange land; a land estranged from God.

Secondly, the old creation might mean doing the right things for the wrong reasons. This is expressed in the life of the elder son. Even though he did not ask for his own inheritance but remained with his father, he was not happy when his brother came back and his father decided to use the fattened calf for a party. He was angry that his father had never done a thing like that for him and when this useless brother of his returns, his father has offered him the best. Even though he was good to his father and doing the right things, he had a wrong reason for doing things: he might be working because he knew everything after his brother left belonged to him alone. Now that the brother is back and his father is too generous, he may still share all, with this "useless" brother of his at the end. He represents some of us and can insinuate that if some of us are kept at the gates of heaven to judge those to enter heaven, might be no one will be found there because forgiveness will not be a part of us. But we all need to strive to leave these forms of the old self to a new creation.

The life in Christ which is a new creation is a life of grace, a life of liberation from slavery and sinfulness. It is, as the second readings says, the work of God. This work was realized in the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ. We find in the first reading that God freed his people from slavery in Egypt and settled them in the promised land. This is true freedom. The life of new creation in Christ is also expressed in the life of the Father in the gospel. It is a life of unconditional forgiveness and mercy, a forgiveness and mercy that do not go back to the past. It's a life that doesn't keep hurts or hateful feelings but rejoices when the old creation wants to transform to the new. It is about us embracing others despite their weaknesses and limitations. It's about giving others many more opportunities after they hurt us badly. It's about realizing that God is in charge. It's about a true and meaningful relationship with God. It's about communion with God in prayers, Confession, mass and at the reception of the Blessed Eucharist. What a beautiful life!

Dear friends in Christ, our Lenten journey is always a journey of purification from the old self to a new self; from the life of the old Adam to the life of the new Adam, Jesus Christ. In this journey, we need to identify on the way the things that take us away from our new selves in Christ and learn to offer these to him to heal and mend them. If we take this journey sincerely, then life for us will become better and happier. This will give us the opportunity then to bring true happiness in our lives and the lives of others too.

Let us rejoice today that our liberation is near at hand, as we put off our old life of sin for a new life of grace in Christ.
