

fr. Jeremy Writer... POPE FRANCIS: A PERSONAL REFLECTION



For me, Pope Francis has represented a most welcome return to Gospel values in the papacy. His great gift was his simplicity and his determination to make the Church a place where the poor and disadvantaged were welcomed and prioritised. His simplicity of life took officials by surprise and his attempts to do away with the pomp that distanced the papacy from the people endeared him to millions within and outside the Church. He had a great love of people, especially the poor and disadvantaged and he will be remembered for his simple but hard-hitting writings and for his appeal to the clergy to get out among the people and get the smell of the sheep about them. Mercy and compassion were the central themes of his papacy, and he made the Gospel the cornerstone of his teaching rather than the institutional legalism that many in authority

subscribed to. This gained him enemies even among the higher echelons of the Church and it will be interesting to see if his legacy is carried on by his successor, please God it will be.

Francis was born Jorge Maria Bergoglio on December 17, 1936, in Buenos Aires, the son of Italian immigrants who fled the fascism of Benito Mussolini. Jorge trained as a chemical technician and also worked part time as a janitor and bouncer. He was fond of football and dancing. A dangerous bout of pneumonia required the removal of part of his right lung at the age of 21. Chest infections were his particular health weak spot for the rest of his life and immediately preceded his death.

On recovering from his illness Jorge joined the Jesuits eventually rising to be Provincial Superior in Argentina in which position he struggled both with the junta of the Peron dynasty and with divisions within the Jesuit Order over engagement with the poor in the city's favellas. Bergoglio was subsequently removed from his position of leadership of the Jesuits in Argentina and effectively sent into exile by his superiors for a period of years. He was rescued from an uncertain fate by his appointment as Auxiliary bishop of Buenos Aires in 1992. He rose then to succeed as Archbishop and became known for his embrace of poverty and simplicity of lifestyle. He once said, "My people are poor and I am one of them". Famously he continued that dictum as Pope.

Francis travelled a complex path from a strict, authoritarian leader among the Jesuits to become the very opposite as Archbishop and Pope where his emphasis was always to associate with the poorest and most deprived and to embrace a simplicity of lifestyle, inspired by his namesake, St Francis, never seen in the papacy before. Far from wielding an authoritarian stick to beat people with unbending church law, Francis has made compassion and mercy the heart of his witness as pope and has encouraged an open and listening leadership with his pursuit of synodality as a central methodology.

I conclude with some words from his Easter sermon which are both prophetic and full of the hope he looked forward to in the face of his own death:

Christ is risen! These words capture the whole meaning of our existence, for we were not made for death but for life. Easter is the celebration of life! God created us for life and wants the human family to rise again! In his eyes, every life is precious! The life of a child in the mother's womb, as well as the lives of the elderly and the sick, who in more and more countries are looked upon as people to be discarded.

Dear brothers and sisters, in the Lord's Paschal Mystery, death and life contended in a stupendous struggle, but the Lord now lives forever (cf. Easter Sequence). He fills us with the certainty that we too are called to share in the life that knows no end, when the clash of arms and the rumble of death will be heard no more. Let us entrust ourselves to him, for he alone can make all things new (cf. Rev. 21:5)!

Happy Easter to everyone! May he rest in peace.

Witnessing to Christ in the World

The Church is in the world and exists for the world. It can never accept a role so narrowly spiritual that its prophetic voice in preaching the fulness of the gospel is silent or that leads its members to renounce their involvement in society. On the contrary, the Second Vatican Council declared that the Church Is "to be a leaven, and, as it were, the soul of human society in its renewal by Christ and transformation into the family of God" (*Gaudium et Spes, n.40*). The created world, all human society and every individual are redeemed by Christ. They each express in an incoherent and obscure way the glory of God "which fills all heaven and earth". The individual Christian and the people of God can, with the eyes of faith, discern the image of God and the face of Christ in the world and in people. It is the mission of the Christian and of the Catholic Church to point to the divine likeness in God's creation, to denounce whatever defaces it and to protect and foster within created reality the true and the divine. Living as he does within the human community the Christian helps continually to transform society into the family of God. This teaching is profoundly significant. It does away with the image of a closed-in Church, having remote mission to an alien and fallen world "out there". It creates an awareness of our presence in a redeemed world and our responsibility for that world.

We have been fortunate in the past to have more than one Justice and Peace Group within the parishes of our Havant Pastoral Area. As we move towards the establishment of the new parish this is the time to work together to establish a new group to concentrate on issues of Justice & Peace/Catholic Social Action. 


