The Scriptures for the Fifth Sunday of Lent: the woman caught in adultery

<u>Isaiah 43:16-21</u> The prophet Isaiah assures the Jews exiled in Babylon that there will be a new Exodus. The message of hope should inspire us also.

<u>Philippians 3:8-14</u> St Paul has willingly sacrificed everything for the privilege of knowing Christ. He hasn't yet arrived but is still running the race of salvation.

<u>John 8: 1-11</u> Jesus refuses to condemn a woman caught in adultery.

Parish Mass Book: page 176 and Prayer of the Church: Week 1

God the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

This prayer is offered by the priest during confession, also known as the sacrament of Reconciliation or Penance. After a penitent confesses their sins, the priest might give some advice and then give a penance, an act of making amends, often prayers offered to God. They then ask the penitent to say an act of contrition. When that is done they then offer the prayer of absolution which formally forgives their sins ritualistically. They are some of the most beautiful words in the Catholic tradition.

Formation for Extraordinary Ministers


