Sunday Reflection

THEME: LET HIM WHO IS WITHOUT SIN AMONG YOU BE THE FIRST TO THROW A STONE AT HER

We are all sinners in need of God's mercy. But more often than not, even though we are sinners, we have the irresistible tendency among us to condemn others in the sins, looking low on them or gossiping about them wherever we find ourselves; all in a bid to prove that we are holier than they are. For such people, a sinner is one who has been caught or one whose sins are known, and a saint is one who has not been caught or whose sins are not known. If God were to expose our sins, who is going to be free?

The readings of today want us to turn away from the "holier than thou" attitude, where we think that we are better people than others in terms of sins. This is brought out eloquently in the words of Christ "Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone at her."

In the Mosaic law, the penalty for adultery was stoning to death. The Jews kept this law to the letter, but the unfortunate thing was that only the women, most of the time suffered this and the men went unpunished. Today, in the gospel, we find a similar situation. The Scribes and the Pharisees bring to Jesus a woman caught in adultery. Don't ask me whether she did it alone or where the man was who did it with her. They bring this woman to Jesus to set a trap for him. They presented their case thus: "Teacher, this woman has been caught in the act of adultery. Now in the law Moses commanded us to stone such woman. What do you say about her?"

This was really a big test for Jesus. If Jesus refuses to abide with the demand of the Mosaic law, then who is he? Blasphemer? When their charge was placed before Christ, he bent down and wrote with his finger on the ground. And as they continued to ask him, he stood up and set their consciences at work: "Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone at her." What a challenge! Is there anyone among us, who is without sin? Who can save us, from this question of Jesus in our parish? When they heard this, we are told they left, one by one, beginning with the eldest. At the end, Jesus is left alone with the woman.

Preaching on this gospel text of today, Emeritus/late Pope Benedict XVI said: "St. Augustine says that the gesture of Jesus portrays him as the divine legislator: in fact, God wrote the law with his finger on tablets of stone. Thus, Jesus is the Legislator, he is justice in person. And what is his sentence? 'Let him who is among you

without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.' These words are full of the disarming power of truth that pulls down the wall of hypocrisy and opens consciences to a greater justice; that of love, in which consists of the fulfilment of every precept."

When we want others to be condemned for their sins, we become hypocrites. We are hypocrites because we are all sinners but want others to pay for their sins; might be because theirs is known and ours unknown to man. God does not want the death of a sinner but wants that they repent and return to him. This has been the entire Lenten message.

When Jesus raised his head from the ground after challenging the scribes and Pharisees, he found the woman by his side alone. He demanded: "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?...Neither do I; go and sin no more." What a merciful Jesus. Two things come to mind with this attitude of Jesus. Firstly, if Jesus were living today, would the masses have allowed him to go away without this woman being condemned? Was Jesus not afraid that he could be misread by the people and condemned for that?

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we should all learn to be merciful like Jesus. He doesn't condemn us in our sinfulness but gives us opportunities every day for conversion. We should learn to do the same with others rather than point condemning fingers at them, or desire they are punished for their sins and mishaps. Let us all not condemn others but go and sin no more.
