

# **Sunday Reflection**

#### THEME: NEW LIFE WITH THE RESURRECTED CHRIST

The resurrection was a scandal to the apostles and to the men of their day. This is what I shared on in yesterday's reflection. Today, we want to look at the new life this resurrection brings for us as Christians. To bring out this message, I will begin with a story about St. Augustine of Hippo. We are told that he lived a wayward life for a long time and his mother had to pray for his conversion for more than a decade. After his conversion, he lived a life built on Christ. A story is told that once, walking in a familiar part of the town he used to frequent in his old days, he got a call from one of the free women she once knew: "Augustine, Augustine" and he continued straight on without turning left or right when the call came the second time. As he continued moving, he said "but it is not 'I'". Yes, the old "I" of Augustine was dead to sin and a new "I" has resurrected in Christ. He was now living a new life in Christ and could no longer go back enjoying the old life of sin. That is what we are called to during this Easter season.

We are all called like St. Augustine to die to the old way of sin and resurrect to a new way of life in Christ. This is what Easter all means to you and to me.

In the gospel, we are given an account of what happened on the morning of Christ's resurrection by John. When Mary Magdala discovered that Jesus has risen from the dead, she was surprised and ran to report r the news to the disciples of Jesus. This report brought Peter and the other disciples to the tomb in order to confirm the report. When they saw everything as it was reported, they believed. When they believed, their lives were no longer the same because with the help of the Holy Spirit, they preached the message of the resurrected Christ.

Christ's dying on the cross and his glorious resurrection was to free us from the dungeon of sin. St. Paul in the second reading of today reminds us that "since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand" (Col 3:1). That is precisely what new life with the resurrected Christ entails - looking for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is. In this light therefore dear friends, "Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God" (Col 3:3).

Dear brothers and sisters, as we celebrate the resurrection of Christ, we therefore need to ask ourselves whether our lives are based on the things of heaven or the things on earth. If it is based on the things on earth, then remember: what does a man gain if he gains the whole world and loses his soul?

Let us therefore examine ourselves and see those things which make us not to live this new life with the resurrected Christ. As well, let us ask our resurrected Christ for the graces to do away with these things and place our eyes, hearts, and actions on the things of heaven.

> "He has Risen, Have faith in him... And he will always be there for you!" "Have a blessed and Happy Easter!"
