Readings of the Day

1st Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 21:8-9. 17-20. 23-24

(Response): My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

2nd Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

Gospel Acclamation: Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory. Christ became for us obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name.

Gospel: Luke 22:14 – 23:56

On this day the Church celebrates Christ's entrance into Jerusalem to accomplish his paschal mystery. Accordingly, the memorial of this event is included in every Mass, with the procession or the solemn entrance before the principal Mass, with the simple entrance before the other Masses. The solemn entrance (but not the procession) may be repeated before one or other Mass that is usually well attended.

Sunday Reflection

THEME: FOR MY PART, I OFFERED NO RESISTANCE

Palm Sunday, which marks the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, begins the celebration of Holy Week. For us as Catholics, this celebration begins when we gather at the entrance of the church or nearby the church, to bless the palm branches that we eventually carry in procession, to join with the whole world in singing Hosanna to the King of Glory. It has always been an emotional moment for me as a Priest celebrating this great day and marching with palms and singing with the Christians, as we walk into church. We missed these processions some time ago because of the Covid-19 pandemic.


As we celebrate Palm Sunday today, I would like us to reflect on the words of the prophet Isaiah in the first reading of today which reads "For my part, I offered no resistance" (Is 50:5). This comes from the third song of the servant of the Lord where the prophet predicts in a way the coming sufferings of the Messiah. It is about a servant whom the Lord had given a disciple's tongue. This is a servant whom God had opened his ears to listen to Him and the Lord had endowed him with the grace of speaking and uplifting the wearied. In this regard, the prophet notes that he made no resistance, nor did he turn away but offered up himself to those who wanted to kill him. They struck him, tore his beard but he did not cover his face against spittle or insults since the Lord came to his help. It is exactly what happened with our Lord and Master, Jesus Christ, whose resolute decision to enter Jerusalem is going to invite for him an identical experience.

Jesus as the Son of God did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped but emptied himself taking the form of a servant being born in the likeness of men (Phil 2:6-7). All this because he wanted to save us from our sins. He gave himself and was disfigured for our salvation. We find him today making that entrance to Jerusalem to die for our sins. On his part, he offered no resistance because he knew how great his mission was to save all of us. Going through the passion narrative, which is recounted by all four gospel writers (Mt 21:1-17; Mk 11:1-11; Lk 19:29-40; Jn 12:12-19), we can find Jesus' wholehearted surrendering to the will of the Father. He knew that he was entering Jerusalem for the last time to pay the price, which will be repeated on Good Friday, so as to provide us with the opportunity to journey through out this week with the Lord and surrender to him. In a

sense, it is a calling to each one of us to remember throughout this week all that Jesus went through for our sake and a call to die to sin and rise with him to new life.

This Palm Sunday, as we are celebrating Palm Sunday, Jesus is asking us to make no resistance in believing in him and in following him, the saviour. He has died to save us from sin and death and wants to share that blessing with us. Can we entrust ourselves to him without any resistance especially alongside those things that take us away from him?

May we pray for the graces to have a fruitful Holy Week where we die to our old life of sin to rise in a new life of grace. To do this, we need not offer any resistance to the promptings of the Holy Spirit working in us. Let us also use this Holy Week to pray for ourselves, family members and friends, priests and religious, world leaders, the sick, souls in purgatory, Ukraine and Russia and for those who do not believe in God.
