Jesus took on himself our human condition and accepted death on a cross. The Father has made him Lord of heaven and earth.

Gospel: Luke 22:14 - 23:56

This is Luke's version of the Passion. As in the rest of his Gospel so here Luke presents a Christ who is merciful and forgiving even to his executioners.
