Habemus Papam ... nomine Leonis

At the seminary in 2013 in the days before the conclave which elected Pope Francis, we had a sweepstake. My secretary, Melissa, drew the candidate with the longest odds and was a bit peeved. She pulled out of the hat the name of a completely obscure cardinal called Jorge Bergoglio. Of course, in the event she scooped the board netting about £60. Last evening history seemed to repeat itself with the election of a cardinal nobody had heard of, Robert Francis Cardinal Prevost, as the new Pope taking the name of Leo XIV. He has been described as the first American Pope, as indeed, he is. But that epithet is misleading as he is by no means a typical member of the US hierarchy. He also has Peruvian citizenship and was not ordained as a diocesan priest but as a member of the Augustinian Order of Friars.

In his maiden speech from the balcony of St Peter's Basilica last evening Pope Leo demonstrated his command of languages by speaking both Italian and Spanish, and in the speech he spoke often of peace and the need for peace in our world of conflict, stressing that peace was the first gift of the Risen Christ to his disciples. In this he chimed with the message of King Charles yesterday at the VE Day celebrations when he urged the need to work tirelessly for peace in a world still riven by conflict. Working and praying for peace will be high on the agenda of both leaders in the years to come.

Robert Francis Prevost was born on September 14, 1955, Chicago, Illinois, to Louis Marius Prevost, of Italian and French descent, and Mildred Martínez, the daughter of Louisiana Creole parents. In September 1977, he joined the Order of St Augustine as a novice, making his solemn profession in 1981. He served extensively as a missionary in Peru as parish priest, seminary professor and diocesan official, and was elected Prior General of the Order of St Augustine in 2001, serving two terms of six years in that Romebased role. In 2013, Pope Francis appointed him Bishop of Chiclayo in Peru, and he returned to that country until 2023 when the late pope assigned him as Prefect of the Vatican Department (Dicastery) for the appointment of bishops and President of the Pontifical Commission for Latin America, creating him cardinal the same year.

Pope Leo is known to be a friend and confident of the late pope and in sympathy with his ideals and his direction for the Church. However, his decision not to be named Francis II, or indeed, to adopt the names of any of the recent popes, suggests he wants to be seen as his own man. In his speech from the balcony last night he stressed the need for both synodality and care for the poor, homeless and disabled, and closeness to the people over and above bureaucracy, strong themes of Pope Francis' pontificate. He also made unity in the Church a priority, acknowledging the need to heal divisions that arose during Francis' papacy. He is unlikely to play to his 'Americanness' aware of the divisions within the US hierarchy and the closeness of some of its members to the ideology of Donald Trump. I predict that the temptation for factions in the American Church and political society to influence Pope Leo because of his Americanne citizenship will be great; he must resist for the sake of the catholicity (universality) of the Church.

A Good Shepherd: This weekend we keep Good Shepherd Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Easter. It is an appropriate occasion to pray for Pope Leo to be a Good Shepherd 'with the smell of the sheep' about him after the example of Jesus, the Good Shepherd who cares for the lost, leads back the stray and protects the flock from harm.

Postscript: Fr James sent the photo below from his friend Barney who is an Augustinian friar (that's him leaning out and smiling behind Pope Francis' chair).

It shows a convention of Augustinians with Pope Francis in Rome and the new Pope is sitting across the aisle from Pope Francis clothed with the habit of the Augustinians wearing and the pectoral cross of the Prior General of the Order.

Witnessing to Christ in the World

The Church is in the world and exists for the world. It can never accept a role so narrowly spiritual that its prophetic voice in preaching the fulness of the gospel is silent or that leads its members to renounce their involvement in society. On the contrary, the Second Vatican Council declared that the Church Is "to be a leaven, and, as it were, the soul of human society in its renewal by Christ and transformation into the family of God" (*Gaudium et Spes, n.40*). The created world, all human society and every individual are redeemed by Christ. They each express in an incoherent and obscure way the glory of God "which fills all heaven and earth". The individual Christian and the people of God can, with the eyes of faith, discern the image of God and the face of Christ in the world and in people. It is the mission of the Christian and of the Catholic Church to point to the divine likeness in God's creation, to denounce whatever defaces it and to protect and foster within created reality the true and the divine. Living as he does within the human community the Christian helps continually to transform society into the family of God. This teaching is profoundly significant. It does away with the image of a closed-in Church, having remote mission to an alien and fallen world "out there". It creates an awareness of our presence in a redeemed world and our responsibility for that world.

We have been fortunate in the past to have more than one Justice and Peace Group within the parishes of our Havant Pastoral Area. As we move towards the establishment of the new parish this is the time to work together to establish a new group to concentrate on issues of Justice & Peace/Catholic Social Action. Retrouvaille

Retrouvaille is a marriage ministry, run by Catholics, to support marriages in trouble. 
