Sunday Reflection

THEME: MY SHEEP HEAR MY VOICE AND FOLLOW ME


Every fourth Sunday of Easter is ordinarily referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday. The purpose of this day in our rich Catholic faith is to publicly fulfil the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send labourers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). It's also a day when we remember Christ our Good shepherd. On this day in the Church, we also celebrate the World Day of Prayers for Vocations, and this year marks the 62nd edition and is always accompanied by a message from the Holy Father. This year as we celebrate vocations to the priesthood and religious life and pray for increase in vocations as well, I would like us to reflect on the fact that the Church is the mother of all vocations; for all vocations are born in the Church, nurtured in the Church and meant to serve the Church. In this light, we reflect on the words of Jesus in the gospel of today: "My sheep hear my voice and follow me."

- 1. My sheep hear my voice: Christ himself listened to his Father's voice and strived to do the Fathers will at all times. This accounts for why despite his busy daily schedule, he always sought to listen to his Father in prayers so that the Father's will may be done; not his. Like Christ who listened to his Father through prayers, prayer as well is the medium through which we can listen to the voice of Christ. This is very important because of the many voices that speak to us daily: the voice of the self, the world, our friends, the devil, Christ, etc. We need to spend ample time in daily prayers to discern the voice of Christ. When we do this, then we shall know Christ and he shall know us as well and the journey to his kingdom shall not be a difficult one for us.
- 2. The sheep that listens to my voice follow me: When we listen to the voice of Christ, we need to follow him. To follow Christ is the response we give to Christ after listening to him. To follow Christ means surrendering ourselves to him, so that he leads us to whatever direction he is calling us to. We need not resist especially if he is calling one of us to the priestly or religious vocations. We find Paul and Barnabas responding positively to the vocation Christ called them to in the first reading. Their preaching in Pisidia (in Antioch) brought many people to listen to the Word of God.

When we listen to Christ and follow him in the right manner, we are assured of one thing, eternal life as St. John describes in the second reading of today. We all need to follow Christ to heaven so that where the Master is, so too we shall be.

As we celebrate the 62nd World Day of Prayers for vocations, let us learn to listen to Christ and follow him. This is the sure guarantee we have for more vocations in the Church. Let us as well pray and encourage vocations to the priestly and religious life; not just today but always. If God is calling you to the priestly or religious vocations, do not resist and do not listen to discouraging voices. This is especially useful because the worse thing in life is to choose a wrong vocation.

May we pray today for vocations in the church and for each one of us to be able to discern the right vocation God is calling us to.
