Sunday Reflection

THEME: ENCOURAGE ONE ANOTHER TO PERSEVERE IN THE FAITH

Ours is a time when we are experiencing a crisis of faith. It is a time when some people think the faith is outdated. Ours is a time of Relativism where people depend on feelings and emotions and subjective views for judging reality. It's a time of Materialism where people spend more time on achieving earthly to spiritual things. It's a time of sophisticated modern technological discoveries which has made man more comfortable and has built for man a modern areopagus; a world where religion and faith is relegated to the backdrop. Relativism, Materialism and technological discoveries have in a sense drifted many from the faith. We are therefore called upon to encourage each other to persevere in the faith. The passing things of this moment may seem nice, but they are ephemeral.

The need to encourage each other to persevere in the faith is what the Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV is calling us to when he preached during his first mass as Pope with the Cardinals. He called everyone to bring the faith especially where money and power has replaced God. Like the Holy Father, it is the same call of St. Paul and Barnabas to the Church in Antioch in today's first reading. We are told that they moved through Lystra, Iconium to Antioch and put fresh heart into the disciples by encouraging them to persevere in the faith especially because when hardships come, people are tempted to neglect the faith.


We too might be going through hardships or experiencing some of those challenges that can take us away from the faith. Are we going to abandon the faith? No matter what happens to us, we need to hold on to the faith we professed at Baptism, or at the reception of First Holy Communion, or at Confirmation. Our faith is what will save us is the message of St. Paul to the Romans and to us.

In order for us to persevere in the faith, three things are suggested for us: prayer, fasting and love. The first two come from the first reading and the last from the gospel. We must note that a prayerful Christian is a powerful Christian. Without prayers, we can't do anything and with prayers we can do everything. Prayer is very important, and we should pray at all times.

For fasting, we should not limit it only to the season of Lent but fast always by denying ourselves of legitimate pleasure and entertainment for the good of our relationship with God.

Finally, let us learn to love. Jesus assures his disciples in the gospel passage of today "I give you a new commandment: love one another; just as I have loved you, you also must love one another. By this love for one another, everyone will know that you are my disciples" (Jn 13:34-35). Can we let love lead us in everything; uncontaminated love? Love is pure when we love as Jesus Christ has loved us.

Let us therefore pray for the graces to encourage ourselves and one another to persevere in the faith especially when trial moments come because that is what will lead us closer to God.
