Sunday Reflection

THEME: MY OWN PEACE I BEQUEATH TO YOU

Peace is a needed gift in the lives of so many individuals, homes, communities, and countries and I think especially in Cameroon, Ukraine, Gaza, Indian and Pakistan at the moment. Peace is not just the absence of war or external cohesion but an internal disposition of calm and quiet even amidst difficulties and challenges. Without this gift of peace, many things go wrong in our lives. For example, some of the sicknesses we suffer daily are the result of the absence of peace in our lives. We all need the gift of Christ's own peace in our lives.

Jesus in today's gospel assures us of this gift when he says: "Peace I bequeath to you, my own peace I give you, a peace the world cannot give, this is my gift to you" (Jn 14:27). The kind of peace Jesus wants to give us is his own peace; peace which is different from what the world gives. This is simply because Jesus' peace is eternal and reliable while that which the world gives is temporal and unreliable. This is true because the systems in the world today, be it governments, political parties, institutions, communities, and families, are all structured towards guaranteeing peace. But most often they miss this goal because the peace they strive to give is not Christ's own peace, but peace according to their own standards.

Peace is greatly needed in many communities today. In the first reading, we find that the peace of the early Christian community had been tampered with by wrong doctrines. This was because disagreements broke out as some men from Judaea came teaching that: "Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved" (Acts 15:1). This had to be resolved by the apostles and peace restored at the first ever council of the Church, the Council of Jerusalem.

As the apostles under the leadership of the Holy Spirit restored peace to the early Christian community that was ransacked by disagreements over issues of doctrine, so too Jesus wants to restore you with the gift of his own peace. This can come when we take into consideration the following fourfold recommendations:

1. Jesus' own peace comes from loving one another. This love is not one which is conditioned by the response we get from others but from our unconditional love for them. It comes from keeping God's words. This is evident when Christ says, "If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him and make our home with him" (Jn 14:23).

2. Jesus' own peace can be experienced when we surrender all to him; all our trials, problems, temptations, challenges, etc. He himself after assuring us of the gift of his own peace to us says "Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid" (Jn 14:27c). So why worry and be troubled of heart when Christ wants to take away all these things and give us the gift of his peace?

3. The peace that Jesus is giving us comes when we focus on him. Many of us focus on so many external things to give us peace: money, cars, businesses, persons, institutions, traditional medicine, law courts, etc. All these cannot give us true peace. True peace comes when we replace these things with Christ. When Peter focused on Christ, he was able to walk on water (Mt 14:22-32). If we focus on Christ as well and on his work, he is going to give us true peace; a peace that the world cannot give.

4. Finally, Jesus' own peace is a gift from the Holy Spirit. It is a fruit from the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit. As such, it gives us a stable disposition which enables us to live out our daily lives joyfully irrespective of the many trials and temptations we may be going through. This means that if we have Jesus' peace, irrespective of turbulent internal/external circumstances and experiences, we remain calm and joyful.

Let us therefore aim at this precious gift which Christ is offering us today and always, the gift of his own peace, and live it out in our daily lives.
