Reflection from Fr Elijah: God Abides with Us, Through the Holy Eucharist

Today is the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ or "Corpus Christi." Although theologically rooted in the very institution of the Eucharist by Jesus Christ on Holy Thursday, it originated as a liturgical observation in France in the mid-thirteenth century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. This feast focuses on two manifestations: the Holy Eucharist as the body of Christ and the Church as the body of Christ.

In the study of Human Nutrition: "You are what you eat" and "good food nourishes the body." While the physical food we eat nourishes the body, spiritual food nourishes our soul, prepares, and preserves it for eternity. The Eucharist, not only makes the soul fit to dwell in a healthy body but also makes it fit to appear before God. In the first reading, God nourished and sustained the Israelites in the desert with manna. In our time, God has given us the Eucharist for our spiritual nourishment. In the second reading, Paul reminds us of the church's unity through sharing in the one Body and Blood of Christ. At Mass, our attention is called to the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. In today's gospel, Christ succinctly proclaimed: "I am the living bread ...Whoever eats the body and drinks the blood of the Son of Man will never die." Hence, the Eucharist sustains our spiritual life, while our human food, like the Manna, sustains our physical and mortal life.
