Sts Peter & Paul (Year C, Cycle 1)

29th June 2025

Reflection from Fr Elijah: The Lord stood by me and gave me strength (2 Tim. 4:17)

Today we celebrate the solemnity of two pillars of the Church, saints Peter and Paul. Very different characters, both were transformed by their encounter with the Lord and united in their witness to him.

Peter, a fisherman from Bethsaida in Galilee, was chosen by Jesus as leader of the apostles. Our Gospel today recounts Simon's (Peter) confession that Jesus is 'the Christ, the Son of the living God' (Mt. 16:15). Simon was never afraid to speak up and say what he thought even when his companions were reduced to silence. Acknowledging the divine inspiration behind Simon's words Jesus replies: 'You are Peter (Rock) and on this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of the underworld shall not prevail against it' (Mt. 16:18). Peter was crucified under Nero and buried at the Vatican

On the other hand, Paul, a devout and zealous Pharisee from Tarsus in Asia Minor (modern day Turkey) was chosen by the risen Christ to bring the gospel to the Gentiles (non-Jewish peoples). St. Paul, perhaps is the greatest missionary of all time. He is portrayed as the tireless voyager, bearing the new faith to the farthest corners of the known world. He is noted for initiating a new age in mission: taking the Gospel beyond the rather confined circle of the apostles and giving concrete expression to its universal relevance. It was Paul who sowed the seeds of Christian faith in many of the great centers of the Roman civilization of his day, including Greece, Italy, Malta. He was beheaded along the *Via Ostiense* and buried on the site nearby.
