Sunday Reflection

THEME: JESUS SATISFIES OUR HUNGER WITH HIS BODY AND BLOOD

Today is the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ commonly called Corpus Christi. The solemnity was established by Pope Urban IV on September 8th, 1264, in a bull Transiturus. The feast ordinarily falls on the Thursday after the feast of the Most Holy Trinity, but in countries where this day is not a day of obligation, the feast is transferred to the nearest Sunday. On this day, we usually have a procession with the Blessed Sacrament to show to the world who Jesus is to us. We did this on Thursday with our school children after we had our whole school mass. For us in Cameroon, this procession is deferred for the Solemnity of Christ the King (last Sunday of the year) because of the rains at this time of the year which may disrupt the procession.

As we celebrate this feast, we are reminded of the fact that Jesus is the only one who can satisfy our hunger. He does so with his body and blood, this is evident in the gospel of today. After spending the whole day in a lonely place with a multitude of over 5.000 people, night fall was approaching, and the apostles demanded Jesus let the people go, so that they can buy something to eat in the neighbouring towns, since they were in an isolated place. But Jesus demands they give them something to eat themselves. With such a large crowd and only five loaves and two fish, how could that satisfy the hunger of the people? But Christ orders them to place them in groups. He took the bread and fish blessed them and gave them to be shared and behold the remains from the banquet totalled 12 baskets. Their hunger was satisfied by Christ.

This same miracle takes place every day in the Eucharistic banquet, where through the action of the priest, Christ performs the same miracle by making himself available to quench our thirst and to satisfy our hunger. But it's rather unfortunate that sometimes we do not avail ourselves worthily for the reception of this great sacrament. We do this by either receiving Christ in a state of sin or without much preparation. The latter accounts for why some people come to Church without participating at the table of the Word but go ahead to participate at the table of the Eucharist. By doing so, we only seek our own condemnation. For those who for one reason or another cannot receive Christ because of impediments (such as cohabitation), we should know that we are missing something great in our lives. Christ wants to satisfy our hunger. Do everything within your power to overcome the blocks, so as to receive Christ present in this most holy Sacrament of the Altar.

As we strive daily to be satisfied in our hunger by Christ, let us as well take up time to adore and worship him in the blessed Sacrament. He is left abandoned in so many tabernacles because many of us are too busy about our own concerns and have no time for him. Can we create time daily or weekly, say an hour or two to adore and worship him before the Blessed Sacrament? Try this out and see the many miracles he is going to perform in our lives.

Today our First Holy Communion candidates will receive the Body and Blood of Christ for the first time. These children have been trained to fall in love with Christ and to hunger for his body and blood always. By themselves they cannot do it but need us the parents and family members to support them in this journey. We need to help them long to receive Christ always and to learn to come before him in prayers and adoration. We need to help them understand the value of this sacrament in their lives so that they know they have something to rely on especially in trying moments.

May we always turn to Jesus when in need and he is going to satisfy our hunger. Nothing on earth can do so for us. As we celebrate this feast, let us in a special way pray for priests who make Christ available to us in the Eucharistic species of bread and wine. Though unworthy we are, may we, priests, allow ourselves to be transformed by Christ so that directed by him, we may lead his people in holiness.

May the Body and Blood of Christ which we receive at mass help us to love and serve him daily.

Please use it either before Mass, during the collection or at the end of Mass. This way we will avoid a crush in the porch with many people trying to make donations.



Also, you will have noticed some slips of paper with a QR code on them. This is another way of accessing the DONA machine rather than queueing at the

machine. Just point your phone's camera at the QR code and then follow the instructions on your phone.
