Sunday Reflection

THEME: CHRIST IS OUR PEACE

There are some areas, countries and people who have not known peace for a while. I think particularly of the people of the two English speaking regions of Cameroon who have not known peace since the close of 2016 and the people of Ukraine, who are at war with Russia to defend their land. I also think of Israel and Iran and the other places experiencing internal turbulence. In such places as above, people go to bed with restless hearts and not sure of seeing the next day. Some go to bed and cannot rest because their eyes are dripping down with tears and they end up getting up with headache or anxieties and depression the next day. There are some who "daydream" because of the problems they worry about, might be ill-health, loss of someone dear, challenges in life, poverty, unfortunate happenings, etc. All these and more take away the peace which they were supposed to be enjoying as children of God.

Are you in crisis, difficulties, going through challenging moments? Is your marriage on the rocks, sickness at your doorsteps, friends troublesome, bereaved, etc.? Despite these, the readings are assuring us that Jesus is our peace. He will give us peace even amidst the difficulties we encounter.

The people in the first reading of today are assured of peace by the prophet Isaiah. They had abandoned God through their sinful ways and were taken captives to Babylon. They worry about the ruined city of Jerusalem and long to go back. The prophet brings words of peace and consolation by assuring them that they will go back home soon. In the gospel, Jesus sends out the 72 disciples to preach the gospel; a gospel that brings peace. He instructs them that their first words to any home they visit should be: peace be to this house. If a person of peace lives there his peace will come there otherwise it will be taken away.

We need to enjoy the peace God gives us each day. Peace was his first words to his apostles after his resurrection. It is the same peace given to us at mass by the priest at the sign of peace. But why is it that peace is nearly absent in the lives of some of us? I have come to realize that peace is taken away from us when we are in sin (because of a guilty conscience), when we concentrate on material things and relationships more than Christ (because they do fail us), and when Christ is absent at the centre of our lives. We need to check out these three things. We surely know many families, communities and individuals who do not enjoy peace. But the question to help us at the moment is: even if I have not been enjoying peace, how then can I get back on track in order to enjoy the peace Christ brings to me? The following thoughts will be helpful.

1. Peace is not the absence of war or the silence of the graveyard. It has to do with the state of mind. That is why it is often said that peace is an inside job. When we have conditioned our minds and know that we can enjoy peace at all times, then we have a different look at life and even amidst sufferings and persecutions, failures and challenges, we shall still enjoy peace.

2. Peace is not gotten from material things or from relationships especially the erotic type. They do fail us and leave us with broken hearts. The lives of many around us can testify to this. So do not allow yourself to be fooled.

3. Peace comes from Christ alone. He is our peace. It comes by listening to his word, reflecting on it and putting it into practice each day. It comes when Christ recites in us and quietens the conscience and emotions that come to derail us. Without the presence of Christ, the heart becomes an erupting volcano.

As we end this reflection, I would invite us to personalise the Prayer for Peace of St. Francis of Assisi which says:

"Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy.

O, Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand; to be loved as to love; For it is in giving that we receive; it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; it is in dying that we are born again to eternal life".

May we pray that the peace Christ gives us each day may be enjoyed by all his sons and daughters who seek him, with sincere and humble hearts and also by those who do not know him or seek him in shades and shadows.
