Sunday Reflection

DON'T BE AFRAID AS IT HAS PLEASED THE FATHER TO GIVE YOU THE KINGDOM

Sometimes in life, we might become too anxious and afraid because of the things we hear or see or because of the things we have to do. We become afraid and anxious if we hear we have cancer or some other disease or if we hear a closed one is seriously sick or going for an interview, etc. We get worked up of what the outcome might be. The apostles and disciples of Christ were also anxious and afraid because of the things Christ had said. Last Sunday, he thought us on the need not to put our hearts on earthly things because they can fail us as it failed the rich farmer and he missed heaven. And so, Jesus assures us today not to be afraid because it has pleased his Father to give us His kingdom.

Dear friends in Christ, we don't need to be afraid because God has given us His kingdom. It is all ours, but we need to make the efforts to enter the kingdom. Three things stand out clearly from the readings of today to help us in this regard:

1. FAITH

Faith has been described in the second reading as that which guarantees the blessings we hope for or the assurance of the realities that at present remain hidden (Heb 11:1). We need this faith daily to help us realise that the kingdom has been given to us and no need to be afraid. This should then help us to work towards the kingdom as Abraham did and was reckoned as a man of faith because of his total trust in God. Even when things happen that make our faith to waver, we shouldn't give up but trust in God knowing that he who has given us His kingdom cannot abandon us in our pains, difficulties, challenges and frustrations.

2. BE READY

With our faith intact, then we need to be dressed for action with our lamps lit. In other words, we need to be ready for the master's return. The life that we have here on earth is for us to prepare ourselves for the coming kingdom of God. Since we do not know when the master will return to take us into that kingdom, all we need to do is to get ready, as Jesus uses parables in the gospel of today to illustrate the need to be ready, so that when the master comes, we are ready. That is why Jesus wants us to be ready like a man waiting for thieves to come so that he can defend his property. To be ready means to be watchful. We need to be

watchful about what we say, hear, think, watch on Tv, do, listen to, etc. Once we are watchful, it gives us a kind of spiritual alertness to always overcome sin.

3. MAKE USE OF THE SACRAMENTS

The fact that we have faith and become watchful is no guarantee that we shall not digress. Therefore, we need the sacraments to always strengthen us. In this regard, I emphasis particularly the sacrament of Confession and our active participation at mass and the worthy reception of Holy Communion. These are great acts that help to purify and strengthen us on our earthly journey into the kingdom which the Father has given to us.

As we celebrate this day, let us know that the kingdom of God is all ours. Let this thought help us to get busy towards achieving this kingdom that Christ worked for us by the shedding of his blood on the cross at Calvary.

NEW APPROACH TO GODPARENTS FOR BAPTISM:

We have come to realise that some parents do not understand the difference between a godparent and a witness for baptism. This has led to situations where none Catholics have stood as godparents for their kids. As a clarification, a witness at baptism can be anyone from any denomination or one without a religion. But a godparent must be a practicing Catholic and one who is able to receive the sacraments. In this light, we would be introducing a form that parents who want their children to be baptised must send to the godparents so that their Parish priest can fill and sign to testify that they are practicing Catholics and regular in their sacramental lives.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION (FHC) PROGRAM 2025

Our FHC program this year shall take a different approach. Only kids of regular and practicing parishioners would be enrolled for the program this year and we shall need a maximum of 30 children for Corpus Christi and the rest go over to St. Joseph. Forms shall be collected from both churches, and the registration shall all be done and submitted on the same day during a meeting with prospective candidates and parents on Thursday 26th of September 2025 at 6pm at the Corpus Christi church. The parents would have a greater role to play in the primary instruction of the children especially on memorising basic prayers and the responses at mass. Once we are convinced that this has been done properly, then the children will begin with the sessions after a retreat.
