Sunday Reflection

THEME: I HAVE NOT COME TO BRING PEACE BUT FIRE AND DIVISION

During the Christmas liturgy, we are reminded by the readings that Jesus is the Prince of Peace. He himself says that all who labour should come to him, and he will give them rest. Ironically, we find him today in the gospel telling us that he is not here to bring peace but fire and division. How can this be? Can this be the true mission of Christ?

In the gospel, we hear Jesus saying: "Do you suppose that I am here to bring peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division" (Lk 12:51). Not just these heavy words but also that he has come to bring fire to the earth, and how he wished it were already blazing (Lk 12:49). Fire to burn who? What are the real meanings of these words? Could Jesus have been talking in metaphorical sense?

Fire is a symbol of testing and judgment; it purifies, burns all that is decayed, it also gives warmth and fosters life. It is the fire of the judgment of God, destroying all that does not react to its reforming action. This shows that the fire is a purifying or cleansing agent. It is the fire of the Holy Spirit, the same fire that came upon the disciples of Jesus on Pentecost and strengthened them for ministry. It is the fire of God's love which we pray for this: "Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of thy faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love." We all need this cleansing fire for our salvation.

To talk of bringing not peace but division to the extent of a household divided against itself; father against son, mother against daughter, mother-in-law against daughter-in-law, etc, what we realize is that once we cannot attune ourselves to live according to the gospel values, there is bound to be division. The truth is that when you stand for what is right, truthful and noble, you go against the currents of many people. The consequence is that they will hate you and want to bring you down and this is the source of the division. It is what Jeremiah suffers in the first reading of today. Jeremiah warns the people to stay clear of their evil ways of life but all he gets is division. They succeeded in getting him and throwing him in a muddy cistern with no water hoping he dies there. Thanks to Ebedmelech, he is saved from the cistern.

Dear friends in Christ, if we are truly followers of Christ, we should allow ourselves to be consumed by the purifying fire of love so that we are able to stand for the truth like Jesus and Jeremiah even if this has to cause division and bring on us the kind of baptism Jesus was to receive (death). For us to do this, then we must follow the two admonitions of the second reading of today. First, we must "throw off everything that hinders us, especially the sin that clings so easily; and keep running steadily in the race we have started" (Heb 12:1). Secondly, "Let us not we lose sight of Jesus, who leads us in our faith and brings it to perfection..." (Heb 12:2).

Let us pray that the Lord will come to our aid as we said in the response to the responsorial psalm to enable us overcome fear which hinders us from standing for the truth. If division can come because we stand for the truth, let us also pray for the graces to endure.

NEW APPROACH TO GODPARENTS FOR BAPTISM

We have come to realise that some parents do not understand the difference between a godparent and a witness for baptism. This has led to situations where none Catholics have stood as godparents for their kids. As a clarification, a witness at baptism can be anyone from any denomination or one without a religion. But a godparent must be a practicing Catholic and one who is able to receive the sacraments. In this light, we would be introducing a form that parents who want their children to be baptised must send to the godparents so that their Parish priest can fill and sign to testify that they are practicing Catholics and regular in their sacramental lives.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION (FHC) PROGRAM 2025

Our FHC program this year shall take a different approach. Only kids of regular and practicing parishioners would be enrolled for the program this year and we shall need a maximum of 30 children for Corpus Christi and the rest go over to St. Joseph. Forms shall be collected from both churches, and the registration shall all be done and submitted on the same day during a meeting with prospective candidates and parents on Thursday 26th of September 2025 at 6pm at the Corpus Christi church. The parents would have a greater role to play in the primary instruction of the children especially on memorising basic prayers and the responses at mass. Once we are convinced that this has been done properly, then the children will begin with the sessions after a retreat.
