### Reflection from Fr Elijah: The Cross of Jesus — A symbol of Triumph and Love.

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross honours the cross on which Jesus Christ was crucified. Today's feast also commemorates the testimony of the power of the Cross, when in 326 St. Helena, the mother of the Emperor Constantine, travelled to Jerusalem to pray. With the guidance of the local Bishops, she discovered the true Cross of Christ at the site of his crucifixion. Acknowledging the reverence due the Cross, two churches were built at the command of Emperor Constantine at the site of the Holy Sepulcher and Mount Calvary.

This feast proclaims the triumph of Jesus on the cross. What was the nature of that triumph? It was firstly the triumph of life over death. It was also the triumph of love over hatred. Furthermore, it was triumph of mercy over sin. Today's feast celebrates the good news that God turned the tragedy of Calvary into a triumph for us all. Through the cross, God's life-giving love and mercy was embracing us all.

Today's feast also reminds us that in our own personal experiences of Calvary, the Lord is present with us in a loving and merciful way, working on our behalf to bring new life out of our suffering and dying. Through the eyes of the resurrection, we can see the cross of Jesus as the triumph of love over hatred, of Jesus' love over the hatred of his enemies, of God's love over the hateful rejection of his Son. The cross will give us strength in our sufferings and remind us of our hope of eternal glory with the risen Lord.
