# **Sunday Reflection**

# THEME: COUNTING AND PAYING THE COST OF DISCIPLESHIP

Planning is an essential element of everything we need to do in life. Here we check out whether we are able to do what we want to do, whether we have the means to go about it and whether we will need support. We also check how we want to go about it and the obstacles that stand on our way and which we must overcome to reach where we want to go or what we want to achieve. Planning is a common phenomenon for individuals, families, business organizations, politicians, etc. So too in the Christian life, planning is important. That is why the readings of today want us to be able to plan and count the cost of discipleship and be ready to pay before we become Christians or disciples of Christ.

In order to count the cost and pay the prize of discipleship, Jesus uses two parables to drive home his point. First, anyone who wants to build a tower must first calculate the cost and see if he can go on with the job to the end. If not, he or she should abandon it. Second, if you want to go to war with another person or nation, you must first consider whether you are capable of doing so. If not, then, make peace before it is too late.

The above implies that being a disciple of Jesus is something that needs great consideration. It means we must take time to consider what the Christian life is all about and be able to see whether we can commit ourselves and live up to it. Without that we will be making choices we cannot live up to.

Counting the cost of discipleship comes out eloquently in the gospel of today. We are told that great crowds accompanied Jesus on his way and he turned and taught them. He begins by observing that: "If any man comes to me without hating his father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes and his own life too, he cannot be my disciple. Anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple" (Lk 14:25-25). The above quotation implies that two things are needed if we must become disciples of Jesus:

- 1. Nothing should stand on our way in making that choice. Our parents, brothers and sisters and even our own will and desires should not be a hindrance to choosing God above all else. Not just that but no ideology, or philosophy, or the things of this world should stand on our way in the choice we have made in following Christ. Also, no material thing should impede us as Jesus demands at the end of the gospel that no one can be his disciple unless he or she gives up his or her possessions. In this sense, Jesus is calling on all his disciples to be detached from the things of this world (Lk 14:33).
- 2. Being a disciple of Christ entails embracing the way of the cross. If we don't want the cross to be part of our lives here on earth, then we should not become Christians. So any Christianity without the cross is foolish. St. Paul tells us something about the cross. He says: "But we preach Christ crucified: a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to

Gentiles, but to those whom God has called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God" (1 Cor 1:23-24). The cross therefore is neither foolishness nor a stumbling block but the power of God for those who trust in him

Two things I have found disheartening here in England is that: first, the choice of Christianity (especially being a Catholic Christian) is sometimes made without due consideration on how we need to live as Christians. Many people choose the Catholic faith because they want their children to go to Catholic schools that offer the best education and not because they want them to grow in the Christian faith. Secondly, Christianity has become a matter of "ticking the boxes". Once the prescriptions offered have been fulfilled then people are made to become baptised pagans. In a sense what i have observed is that people do everything it takes to have their children baptised, received First Holy Communion and Confirmation and it ends at that level. They will attend the classes and whether they know what is taught or not, they are qualified for the sacraments. They will tick their names after masses on Sunday and that is enough proof of their qualification for becoming Christians or receiving the Sacraments. In such situations, we are only fooling ourselves and wasting time. That is why we have confirmed Christians who don't even know anything about the faith. What a

The above challenge is incumbent on all of us to stand up and help our children and ourselves to pick up the Christian faith consciously and live up to standards. It is a challenge because there is no need to become a Christian and be fighting for spaces in hell with those who have out rightly rejected God in their lives. Let us therefore consider our choice of Christianity, or Catholicism: was it imposed on me or a free choice? What does it take for me to re-live the Catholic faith? Is it worthwhile doing this and how can I live up to it. It will be difficult trying to live our faith as it is. But let us ask for the necessary graces to do so daily; counting the cost and carrying our crosses and following Christ.

#### **NEW APPROACH TO GODPARENTS FOR BAPTISM**

We have come to realise that some parents do not understand the difference between a Godparent and a witness for baptism. This has led to situations where none Catholics have stood as Godparents for their children. As a clarification, a witness at baptism can be anyone from any denomination or one without a religion. But a Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and one who is able to receive the sacraments. In this light, we would be introducing a form that parents who want their children to be baptised must send to the Godparents so that their Parish priest can fill and sign to testify that they are practicing Catholics and regular in their sacramental lives.

### **JUBILEE PLANNING MEETING OUTCOME**

The ongoing parish activities during this jubilee year, Pilgrims of Hope are as follows. First Friday adoration to be done in our parish churches after masses from 10am to 6pm. Parishioners encouraged to sign up for adoration time slots.

#### FIRST HOLY COMMUNION (FHC) PROGRAM 2025

Our FHC program this year will take a different approach. Only children of regular and practicing parishioners will be enrolled for the program this year and we shall need a maximum of 30 children for Corpus Christi and the rest will go over to St. Joseph. Forms will be collected from both churches, and the registration will all be done and submitted on the same day during a meeting with prospective candidates and parents on **Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> September 2025 at 6pm at the Corpus Christi church.** The parents will have a greater role to play in the primary instruction of the children especially on memorising basic prayers and the responses at mass. Once we are convinced that this has been done properly, then the children will begin with the sessions after a retreat.
