## **EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS**

**[24<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME] 13/14 SEPTEMBER 2025**

**Fr. James writes...**

It has been a great JOY to welcome Fr Tom Hiney into our Parish this week. I have been amazed how quickly he has unpacked and arranged his rooms and is ready for his new Mission with us. Yesterday, we found ourselves walking from St Michael's, Leigh Park, to St Thomas More School in the pouring rain to speak to First Holy Communion Parents about the Alpha courses going on. I think Fr Tom is going to help me get fitter! It was lovely, last night too, to have Fr Jeremy, back briefly, as yesterday, he attended a Jubilarian Mass and Lunch at Bishop's house, celebrating his 50 years of priesthood. He is very well and sends his love and prayers to you all.

It certainly has been a busier Summer than normal with lots of things going on following Fr Jeremy's departure. The office staff are now all based in the Parish Centre and the new phone systems are up and running. Sorry for the disturbance with this! Maureen Graham from Justice and Peace writes...

Friends first I wish to thank you and give Praise and Glory to the Holy Spirit for making it possible for me to speak to you about this Bill and for all your support and love shown to me personally.

This Bill which is to be voted in House of Lords on 12th September has now been given a further date of 19th September as to date there are 201 Lords wishing to speak about this Bill. Please let's put our faith into action and write opposing this Bill. We need to have better care and compassion for the sick and dying. May God bless you all.

## How to write To Peers in The House of Lords

[Information taken from Bishops' Conference of England & Wales website]...

Unlike MPs, Members of the House of Lords do not have constituents, meaning there is not a Peer whose job it is to represent you based on the area of the country in which you live.

For this reason you should take some time to think about which Peer you will write to and why, such as whether you have a personal or professional connection with them, or you have professional expertise in medicine or healthcare. If you know a former MP for your constituency has been elevated to the House of Lords they may be interested in hearing from you.

Many Peers do not have publicly available email addresses, so it is generally better to write letters to them. You can search through the Parliament website to find a Peer you may wish to write to using this page on the [members.parliament.uk/members/Lords](https://members.parliament.uk/members/Lords) (copy and paste into your browser). This page also provides an option to search for Peers with a specific policy interest, such as Health Services and Medicine, or Crime, Civil Law, Justice and Rights. You may find guidance on how to formally address Members of the House using this page.

### What to include in your letter

The following points can be emphasised in your letter to a Peer:

**The Bill fails to protect healthcare and end-of-life care institutions**, such as hospitals, hospices and care homes from being required to facilitate assisted suicide. There are a number of Catholic and other faith-based hospices and care homes around England and Wales, many of which are run by religious orders and which are seriously concerned about the impact of this Bill on their future. Hospices, such as St Joseph's in London, have already made their opposition to assisted suicide known, and showed how it is inconsistent with the ethos of palliative care. Toby Porter, CEO of Hospices UK has commented: "The implications for hospices must not be underestimated or sidelined. There are huge unanswered questions."

In its current form **the Bill does not sufficiently protect the right of medical practitioners to opt out of participating in assisted suicide**. Requiring practitioners to participate in assisted suicide undermines their duty of care, fundamentally changing the relationship between the medical professional and the patient. Doctors and nurses will be unable to opt out of their duty to direct patients to information about assisted suicide. This serious conflict between professional responsibility and personal conscience will be devastating for Catholic practitioners and may cause many of them to leave the medical profession.

**This Bill puts the lives of vulnerable patients at risk due to inadequate safeguards against coercion**. Evidence from other jurisdictions indicates that patients often feel pressured to choose assisted suicide because they feel as though they are a burden on those caring for them. In addition, countries such as Canada demonstrate that wherever assisted suicide is initially introduced for a limited group, the criteria quickly expand to include the non-terminally ill, and soon those without mental capacity. Moreover, introducing assisted suicide does not reduce the overall number of suicides. Where palliative care provision is absent, individuals will inevitably feel pressured to end their lives.

Once, rains fell reliably, fields were green, and water was close by but now the seasons in Ethiopia are unpredictable, and long droughts are forcing women like Waré to walk for hours each day just to find water for drinking, washing, and livestock.

"It was very traumatising," Waré says. "When I was pregnant, I had to go fetch water in the mountains. Sometimes I felt so weak I could fall down, so I worried about my child."

Yet, Waré refused to give up. Guided by her own faith and uniting with her neighbours, she took action. With support from CAFOD and local water expert Abbiott, they built an underground water tank to collect and store every precious drop of rain. Now, over 300 families have safe, clean water just a few steps from their homes. I look forward to seeing you at our meeting on 20th September.
