#### fr. Tom writes...

Some of you may know the story of Sister Clare Crockett. If not, I would urge you to watch her story on YouTube: *All or Nothing: Sister Clare Crockett*. Just before Christmas, a diocese in Spain formally opened the cause for her Canonisation (hence her now being formally known as a 'Servant of God'). If she is declared a Saint, it will be the most extraordinary turn of events for this former actress, TV presenter and party girl from Derry in Northern Ireland.

A book produced by her congregation, the Servant Sisters of the Home of the Mother, *Sr. Clare: Alone with Christ Alone*, is even more moving. There, we have the depth of a remarkable woman's holiness, and proof that the lives of saints are invariably full of battles invisible to the rest of us, in the intensity of which they draw ever closer to God. The joy we see in the documentary, and the testimonies of her charisma we hear from those touched by her life, are all the more heroic when we read her correspondence with her spiritual director.

In April 2106. she was killed in an earthquake in rural Ecuador, where she was working at a mission school. "Long live the magnanimous souls that seek only God's glory!" she once wrote, and this truly was her life. Rather than subduing the vibrant personality that had catapulted her from humble origins to the verge of international movie stardom, that vibrancy became sanctified. Even when she yearned to be alone, suffering as she did from migraines, she literally gave everything to God, including her personality, and humour.

In the film, mostly made up of video clips taken on phones over the thirteen years of her religious life, we see grace literally take her over. By the end, despite her tiredness, she was beautiful in a way that the movie industry, with all its make-up and costume and lighting, could never have made her, glowing from the inside out. Around 8m people have already watched this film in English or Spanish, and that will only grow as her Cause continues, and her story spreads. It is a very special story about a very special soul.

#### Second Collection this weekend for Home Missions

Evangelii Gaudium Sunday (formally known as Home Mission Sunday) is observed annually on the third Sunday of September. It is a day dedicated to proclaiming the joyful message of the Gospel—a message that brings hope and transformation to all who receive it with an open heart.

This year, the Church commemorates a significant milestone: the 1,700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea. This historic gathering of bishops laid the foundation for the creed we profess each Sunday, a creed that expresses the core of our faith and mission—to know and love God in this life, in order to be happy with Him forever in the next. The creed begins with the powerful declaration, "I believe," which serves as the theme for Evangelii Gaudium Sunday 2025.

This special Sunday highlights the Church's evangelisation efforts at both parish and diocesan levels. It offers a theme and resources for reflection, and encourages each parish to hold a collection to support the national work of evangelisation through the Directorate for Mission.

Once, rains fell reliably, fields were green, and water was close by but now the seasons in Ethiopia are unpredictable, and long droughts are forcing women like Waré to walk for hours each day just to find water for drinking, washing, and livestock.

"It was very traumatising," Waré says. "When I was pregnant, I had to go fetch water in the mountains. Sometimes I felt so weak I could fall down, so I worried about my child."

Yet, Waré refused to give up. Guided by her own faith and uniting with her neighbours, she took action. With support from CAFOD and local water expert Abbiott, they built an underground water tank to collect and store every precious drop of rain. Now, over 300 families have safe, clean water just a few steps from their homes. I look forward to seeing you at our meeting on 20th September.

# Season of Creation | September - 4 October

The World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, which was celebrated on 1 September is the official start of the Season of Creation, a time of sustained prayer and action which lasts a month and four days. This year, 2025, is the 65th jubilee of Canon David Mahy with us today and the diamond anniversary of Bishop Crispian and Fr. John Doran. As Fr. John is unwell, he's unable to be with us, so please pray for
