Sunday Reflection

THEME: WHOM DO YOU SERVE: GOD OR MONEY?

Life ways presents us with alternatives from which we can make choices. The choices we make constitute in some sense and at some times, what we want to wear, drink, eat, or the kind of car we want to drive, house to live in, career to pursue, etc. This is the same with the Christian life. It consists of making a choice between serving God or the evil one. Even when we make a choice for God, there are still other options open for us to make further choices. We are called today to make a choice as to whom to serve: God or money? I will recommend that we make a choice for God because when we do that, we have every other thing even money inclusive. But when we make a choice for money, we can have money but lost God.

Our theme of today is drawn from the conclusion of Jesus in today's gospel when he says: "No servant can be the slave of two masters: he will either hate the first and love the second, or treat the first with respect and the second with scorn. You cannot be slave both of God and of money" (Lk 16:13). Jesus brings this out within the context of a parable of a servant who instead of serving his master, served his own ends and was wasteful with his master's property. When the master heard about his dealings, he demanded he gives and account of his stewardship in view of dismissal. Since this servant was too astute, he decided to double-deal his master by reducing the debts of his master's debtors in order to beg for friendship when he is dismissed. Since he had decided to serve money rather than his master, he could not see himself not making use of the last opportunity.

We should not be like this servant who neglected to serve his master but rather served his own ends. We should not choose to serve money because it does not profit us at the end of time. We must realize that choosing to serve money is a distraction and an opening to so many sinful ways: trampling on the needy, suppressing the poor, breaking the Sabbath laws, and adjusting the measuring scales as Amos laments in the first reading of today (Amos 8:4-6). When we choose money, the truth is that we end up in unfair business deals and we lost touch with the reality of the poor. We only want to amass for ourselves at the expense of others. But we must be warn and take into consideration the words of St. Paul to Timothy in his first letter to him when he says: "We brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it; but as long as we have food and clothing, let us be content with that. People who long to be rich are a prey to temptation; they get trapped into all sorts of foolish and dangerous ambitions which eventually plunge them into ruin and destruction. 'The love of money is the root of all evils' and there are some who, pursuing it, have wandered away from the faith,

and so given their souls any number of fatal wounds" (1 Tim 6:7-10). This must be seen also in line with the words of Ps 49 that talks about the futility of riches.

The above is true because my little experience in life can testify to this as I have seen many, drifted from the Lord because of love of money. Some go as far as selling themselves to the devil in order to make money in life. The truth is that when we concentrate on pursuing money, we neglect moral and human values and go for anything that will bring us money.

Dear friends in Christ, we should learn to love God sincerely and serve him with all our hearts. It is true that even when we choose to serve God we might be distracted by the cares of this world. But we should never relent in making the effort to go closer to Jesus for the graces we need to remain faithful to him. This accounts for why we need to pray for our leaders, for ourselves and one another, making petitions, intercessions and thanksgiving to God as St. Paul recommends in the second reading of today. Prayer is the key to help us discern God's will for us and to live according to that will daily.

May we always strive to seek God daily and serve him faithfully rather than money.



NEW APPROACH TO GODPARENTS FOR BAPTISM

We have come to realise that some parents do not understand the difference between a Godparent and a witness for baptism. This has led to situations where none Catholics have stood as Godparents for their children. As a clarification, a witness at baptism can be anyone from any denomination or one without a religion. But a Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and one who is able to receive the sacraments. In this light, we would be introducing a form that parents who want their children to be baptised must send to the Godparents so that their Parish priest can fill and sign to testify that they are practicing Catholics and regular in their sacramental lives.

JUBILEE PLANNING MEETING OUTCOME

The ongoing parish activities during this jubilee year, Pilgrims of Hope are as follows. First Friday adoration to be done in our parish churches after masses from 10am to 6pm. Parishioners encouraged to sign up for adoration time slots.

- 1. Jubilee prayer and the prayer of hope bookmark will be said after every mass throughout the jubilee year.
- 2. A Parish Jubilee pilgrimage 4th of October 2025
- 3. Jubilee "faith in action" plan. We are all encouraged to put into practice our corporal works of mercy; to feed the hungry, visit the sick, give drink to the thirty, clothe the naked, etc.
- 4. Closing of the jubilee year in Advent 2025.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION (FHC) PROGRAM 2025

Our FHC program this year will take a different approach. Only children of regular and practicing parishioners will be enrolled for the program this year and we shall need a maximum of 30 children for Corpus Christi and the rest will go over to St. Joseph. Forms will be collected from both churches, and the registration will all be done and submitted on the same day during a meeting with prospective candidates and parents on **Thursday 25th September 2025 at 6pm at the Corpus Christi church.** The parents will have a greater role to play in the primary instruction of the children especially on memorising basic prayers and the responses at mass. Once we are convinced that this has been done properly, then the children will begin with the sessions after a retreat.
