In 2014, Bishop Philip issued to the clergy and people of the Diocese some Guidelines for Funerals and for the Care of the Terminally III. The Guidelines should be followed in our Diocese when planning a funeral for a Catholic person who has died. The leaflet also enables Catholics to leave instructions about their own funeral for their next of kin, and in addition, some notes are given for the care of Catholics who are terminally ill. When a Catholic dies, it is the usual custom of the Catholic Church for them to be brought to their parish church & for a Requiem Mass to be offered up for them. This is the case even for those who during their lifetime rarely practiced their Catholic faith. Catholics believe that when a person dies, it is a priority to offer Mass, because it is the Sacrifice of Christ & in the Mass the Church pleads to the Lord, asking him to forgive the sins and weaknesses of the deceased & to admit them into the communion of the saints. 

BLESSED CARLO ACUTIS: A SAINT FOR THE DIGITAL AGE

Carlo Acutis, born on May 3, 1991, in London, was an ordinary boy with an extraordinary love for God. Raised in Milan, Italy, by Italian parents, Carlo was cheerful, intelligent, and deeply spiritual from a young age. His passion for computers developed alongside a growing devotion to the Catholic faith, which he embraced with his whole heart.



While many young people use the internet for entertainment, Carlo saw it as a way to

evangelize. He taught himself computer programming and used his talents to create a website that catalogued Eucharistic miracles from around the world. His goal was to help people better understand the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Carlo once said, "The more we receive the Eucharist, the more we will become like Jesus." He considered the Eucharist "the highway to heaven" and encouraged others to attend daily Mass, just as he did from the age of seven.

Carlo lived a life of prayer and compassion. He had a deep love for the Virgin Mary, prayed the rosary daily, and was always ready to help those in need. He defended classmates who were bullied and often gave his pocket money to the poor. Despite his talents and intelligence, Carlo remained humble, always pointing others toward God, not himself.

At the age of 15, Carlo was diagnosed with an aggressive form of leukemia. He offered his suffering for the Pope and the Church, saying, "I offer all the suffering I will have to suffer for the Lord, for the Pope, and the Church." He passed away peacefully on October 12, 2006. His life, though short, had a lasting impact.

In 2020, Carlo Acutis was beatified by Pope Francis, bringing him one step closer to sainthood. He is often called the "patron saint of the internet" because of his innovative use of technology to share the Gospel. On 7 September 2025, he will be canonized, officially becoming the first millennial saint.

Two miracles have been attributed to his intercession. The first involved a young boy in Brazil named Mattheus who suffered from a rare and deadly pancreatic condition. After prayers were said to Carlo, the boy made a full and unexplained recovery. The second miracle occurred in Costa Rica. A girl named Valeria suffered a severe head injury in a bicycle accident. Her mother visited Carlo's tomb in Assisi to pray, and shortly after, Valeria began to recover in what doctors called a medically inexplicable healing. Both miracles were rigorously investigated by the Church and accepted as signs of Carlo's heavenly intercession.

Carlo's life resonates deeply with young people today because he was one of them. He lived in the modern world, loved video games and soccer, and understood the challenges of staying faithful in a digital age. Yet, he proved that it's possible to be holy and joyful while embracing modern technology and living a normal life.

His story continues to inspire Catholics around the world, especially youth and those working in technology. Carlo once said, "Sadness is looking at ourselves, happiness is looking towards God." He encouraged others to live with purpose, reminding everyone that "we are all born as originals, but many die as photocopies." His message is clear: live authentically, live with God, and use your talents to do good.

As we look forward to his canonization, Carlo Acutis remains a shining example of what it means to be a saint in the 21st century—a teenager who loved God deeply, used his gifts for others, and left behind a legacy of faith, courage, and compassion.

BLESSED PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI: MAN OF THE BEATITUDES

Pier Giorgio Michelangelo Frassati was born on April 6, 1901, in Turin, Italy, into a wealthy and influential family. His mother, Adelaide Ametis, was a noted painter, and his father, Alfredo Frassati, was the founder of the newspaper *La Stampa*, later serving as an Italian senator and ambassador. Though raised in a largely secular household, Pier Giorgio developed a deep spiritual life from an early age, joining the Marian



Sodality and Apostleship of Prayer. He received special permission to take daily Communion, which was uncommon at the time, and his devotion to the Eucharist and the Blessed Virgin became central to his life.

At 17, he joined the St. Vincent de Paul Society, dedicating himself to the service of the poor, sick, and marginalized, especially returning World War I veterans. He studied mining engineering at the Royal Polytechnic University of Turin, saying he wanted to "serve Christ better among the miners." Alongside his studies, he was active in Catholic Action, the Catholic Student Foundation, and the People's Party, promoting Catholic social teaching as outlined in *Rerum Novarum*.

Pier Giorgio saw the poor not as objects of pity, but as his "masters." He frequently gave away his food or bus fare, and skipped family vacations to remain in Turin, saying, "If everybody leaves, who will take care of the poor?" His spiritual life was nourished by Eucharistic Adoration, Scripture—especially St. Paul's "Hymn of Charity"—and the writings of St. Catherine of Siena.

An avid outdoorsman, Pier Giorgio loved mountain climbing and often invited friends along, using the trips to share his faith through prayer, the Rosary, and Mass. He also enjoyed art, theatre, poetry, and music, memorizing long passages from Dante and attending operas and museums. In 1922, he joined the Lay Dominicans, taking the name "Girolamo" after the fiery Renaissance preacher Savonarola, whom he admired.

His strong opposition to Fascism and Communism sometimes led to clashes in public, but he never hesitated to defend the Church and its teachings. During a demonstration in Rome, he famously picked up a fallen Catholic banner and held it high, shielding himself with its pole when attacked by police.

In 1925, just before completing his degree, Pier Giorgio contracted poliomyelitis, likely from one of the many sick people he served. Though gravely ill, he continued helping others, writing a final note to arrange medicine for a man in need. He died on July 4, 1925, at only 24 years old.

At his funeral, thousands of poor and working-class people lined the streets—many whom his family had never met—grieving the death of the young man who had quietly served them. His legacy as a man of faith, service, and joy left a profound impact.

Pope John Paul II, deeply inspired by Pier Giorgio, beatified him on May 20, 1990, calling him the "Man of the Eight Beatitudes." His incorrupt body was exhumed in 1981 and now rests in Turin's cathedral, drawing pilgrims—especially young people—seeking to live lives of holiness in the modern world.

On November 20, 2024, Pope Francis announced that Pier Giorgio will be canonized. This is now scheduled on the 7th September 2025.

Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati stands today as a powerful example of how to live a vibrant, Christ-centered life—devoted to both faith and action, in service to others and in love of God.
