

Prison Advice and Care Trust

This Sunday is Prisoner's Sunday. It is an opportunity to consider how we, as individuals, as a Church, and as communities, are serving our brothers and sisters affected by imprisonment. Prisons are in crisis. There are record numbers of people behind bars with instances of vermin, violence, self-harm and extreme boredom. Also, too many people are released with no home, no job, no family and no hope. The ripple effects of this crisis are felt well beyond the prison walls. The lives of thousands of families and children are affected as they too, serve a hidden sentence. Having a mother, father, husband or wife in prison can have a devastating impact; more than half of families tell us they are struggling to afford the basics for themselves and their children. Please remember prisoners and their families in your prayers.



SS Carlo Acutis & Pier Giorgio Frassati

We welcome two new saints Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati. They were canonized together on September 7, 2025, by Pope Leo XIV. They serve as modern models for sainthood despite different their eras and upbringings. Acutis, a millennial known as the 'cyber-apostle', used his tech skills to spread Eucharistic devotion, while Frassati, an early 20th-century mountaineer, championed social reform and dedicated his life to the poor. Both came from wealthy families but lived lives of profound faith, serving as inspiration for young people to embrace holiness.

Warning - Parking Penalties

I have been told by two people associated with the parish that they have received expensive penalties after using the car park at the Riverside while visiting the pub for lunch. Apparently, the pub chain has contracted with a parking management company to prevent non-patrons from parking there.

Patrons are expected to enter their registration number into a terminal at the bar, but this is not obvious. In one case the driver was notified by email (which was intercepted by a scam filter), and they only realised the penalty had been issued when a debt collection company notified them.

This is unfortunately a trend, and I urge you all to be careful even when you have parked somewhere for years without problems.
