Philip Hayllar. Justice & Peace Group. writes...

Our Lead Bishop for Migrants and Refugees, Bishop Paul MacAleenan, offers this message:

This year, 2025, the annual World Day of Migrants and Refugees will be celebrated on the 4 and 5 October. In Rome, in this year of Jubilee, Pope Leo will preside over two days of celebrations and festivities.

Closer to home in England and Wales, parishes and schools will also mark the event. It is a day for acknowledging the presence of migrants and refugees in our communities, celebrating their contribution and becoming more aware of the difficulties they encounter.

The World Day of Migrants and Refugees is not a new event - it has been marked in the Catholic Church since 1914 - an indication that the movement of people from their homeland is not a recent phenomenon. Throughout history, people have migrated in search for a better life for themselves and their families. However, the number of displaced people is growing due to war, persecution, poverty and the climate emergency which is robbing many people of the opportunity to build a sustainable life in their place of origin.

Everyone loves their country, including those who are forced to leave their homeland. As we move through the streets of our towns and cities today, we see a proliferation of flags and insignia flying from lamp posts. For many, these represent love of country and patriotism. Yet, unfortunately, such displays are also often associated with sentiments opposed to immigration and migrants.

Love of country is honourable and so is love of neighbour. In speeches, demonstrations and rallies, which have taken place in recent months and weeks, those two virtues - love of country and love of neighbour - have not come together.

"Who is my neighbour?", Jesus was asked. In answer, Jesus gave the Parable of the Good Samaritan - my neighbour is anyone in need.

Our Christian response

What should our Christian response be to those who are finding their ways to our shores? Those who have made their way here have done so in desperation - motivated by their desperate plight. That desperation is combined with a longing for a better life. Anyone who has encountered refugees and migrants can confirm that 'hope' is present too.

Pope Leo speaks of these travellers as "witnesses of hope". He speaks of how their courage and tenacity bear heroic testimony to a faith. Faith that sees beyond what our eyes can see and gives them strength to defy death on the migration routes - many of which are perilously unsafe.

Our duty to care for those who seek refuge

Hostility and prejudice towards migrants and refugees, whatever its source – whether it is spoken or indicated in another way – must not make us lose hope or harden our hearts. It is our obligation to try and understand why migrants appear among us; our duty is to care for those who seek refuge in our country.

Applying for a place at Oaklands Catholic School – A Simplified Version



This simplified version of applying for a place does not override the need to read in full the policy and procedure which details the admission of students to Oaklands Catholic School and which is available on the school website.

Students are admitted at 11+ without reference to ability or aptitude. The proposed published admission number (PAN) for Oaklands Catholic School is 232.

1. All applications to Oaklands Catholic School must be made on the Local Authority Common Application Form, (CAF) available to complete online via the [Local Authority website](#). Paper forms are available, from either the students' current school or the Admission Team but only on request.
2. The national deadline is 31st October 2025 for admission in September 2026.

IF YOU FAIL TO COMPLETE THE CAF THEN EVEN IF YOU COMPLETE A SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION FORM (SIF) – SEE BELOW, YOUR APPLICATION WILL NOT BE REGISTERED WITH THE SCHOOL.

3. In addition to the Common Application Form, we request that Parents complete a separate Supplementary Information Form (SIF). The additional information on this form assists Governors in placing applications in the correct oversubscription category (see the policy for details of these categories).
4. The Supplementary Information Form (SIF) is obtainable from Catholic Primary Schools, the Admission Secretary at Oaklands Catholic School, the [school web site](#) or the Local Authority.
5. The SIF should be returned SEPARATELY to the Admissions Secretary at Oaklands Catholic School together with any supporting documentation e.g. a baptism certificate by 31st October 2025.

IF YOU FAIL TO SUBMIT A SIF GOVERNORS CAN ONLY RANK THE APPLICATION ON THE BASIS OF THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE COMMON APPLICATION FORM (NOTE THIS INCLUDES NO REFERENCE TO FAITH BACKGROUND).

Without a SIF, in the event of oversubscription, the Governors would be unable to apply the correct tiebreak criteria. AS A RESULT, APPLICANTS MAY BE RANKED IN A LOWER CATEGORY.

Please also note that the Governors cannot reuse information submitted to the school to support a Supplementary Information Form that was used in an historic application round. For example, if evidence was submitted to support a SIP in 2024 it would have to be resubmitted when applying for a sibling in the following years.

Governors can only use the information they are given in a particular application round to rank applicants in the correct category. Do not assume because you have other students already admitted to the school that a sibling will be placed in the correct category unless a completed SIF and the necessary supporting evidence for that student is submitted (and that you have completed the Common Application Form).

ABORTION UP TO BIRTH - LIFE UK

Season of Creation | September – 4 October
