Sunday Reflection

THEME: LORD, INCREASE MY FAITH

Faith is one of those elements of our Christian life which if missing, our lives become frustrated. This is simply because we will lack the zeal to go about the things we would have done without any problem. Today, we find the apostles asking Jesus to increase their faith. That is what we need to ask God daily to increase; our faith as well, especially that we might hold on to him in every situation.

When we look at the beginning verses of the seventeenth chapter of Luke's gospel, we realize that there is no evident nexus between Christ's statement on faith in answer to the apostles' request, and the parable which follows, except perhaps that faith alone is not sufficient since the follower of Christ must also do his duty.

When the apostles ask the Lord to increase their faith, what they were asking is greater confidence, greater trust in God, so that they could work the miracles which our Lord worked. This becomes evident when we see the contexts in Matthew and Mark in which the same idea is expressed. Our Lord had withered a fig-tree by a simple wish. The apostles marvelled at this. He told them that if they had greater faith, they could order a mountain to hurl itself into the sea and it would obey them (Mt 21:18ff; Mk 11:20ff). What the apostles needed therefore was greater trust in God.

We too as Christians need that total trust in God. We need to ask God to increase our faith so that we can do the impossible: uproot mulberry trees into the sea. This means a faith that has no boundary. It hopes for anything. This is especially relevant for us today where our faith is slackened by so many things: poverty, family squabbles, scandals in the Church, misunderstandings, cheating, killings, etc. It was not different in the times of the prophet Habakkuk. The prophet lived over 600 years before Christ under the reign of King Jehoiakim. The king did nothing to protect the weak and the poor and so allowed them to be oppressed. The people complained to the prophet who consults God on their behalf. The first part of the first reading reports what the prophet told God: "How long, Lord, am I to cry for help while you will not listen; to cry 'Oppression!' in your ear and you will not save? Why do you set injustice before me, why do you look on where there is tyranny? Outrage and violence, this is all I see, all is contention, and discord flourishes" (Hab 1:2-3). We must have cried to God sometimes in such tunes or even more. We need faith at such moments when the waters seemed to be stirred and the waves frightening and drowning us, for God can never allow us to sink.

The second part of the first reading is God's response to the plight of the people of Israel. God promises that nothing will happen for a while; that is, some time would have to pass before their liberation. The people should not be discouraged for God would intervene when the time comes (Hab 2:2-4). It might be our own situation as well where God wants us to endure in whatever we are going through now. Let us not let our faith die out because of the situation we are going through. God is going to act at the appropriate hour. Just have faith in him

May Our faith in God never fail us or challenge us to turn our backs from him. Let us have this at the back of our minds and pray for an increase in faith especially when the candle of faith seems to be dying out. Let us remember that faith gives us a new vision of the world. Without it we see only the darker side of life.

NEW APPROACH TO GODPARENTS FOR BAPTISM

We have come to realise that some parents do not understand the difference between a Godparent and a witness for baptism. This has led to situations where none Catholics have stood as Godparents for their children. As a clarification, a witness at baptism can be anyone from any denomination or one without a religion. But a Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and one who is able to receive the sacraments. In this light, we would be introducing a form that parents who want their children to be baptised must send to the Godparents so that their Parish priest can fill and sign to testify that they are practicing Catholics and regular in their sacramental lives.
