Sunday Reflection

THEME: PRAY CONTINUALLY AND NEVER LOSE HEART

Jack Ma was born on 10th September 1964. He is China's richest person, Asia's second-richest person, and a retired Chinese business magnate, investor, politician, and philanthropist. He is the co-founder and former executive chairman of Alibaba Group, a multinational technology conglomerate. But how did he get there? Ma experienced many failures in his life. He wanted to go to college but had trouble passing the entrance exam. On his third attempt, he barely passed the exams, which allowed him to enrol in the less-than-prestigious Hangzhou Teacher's Institute. Upon graduation, he was rejected for over a dozen positions but eventually got a job teaching English at a local university. When he discovered the internet in 1995 while visiting a friend in the United States, he saw an opportunity to bring the World Wide Web to China. His failures did not frighten him from taking the challenge. He persisted and so succeeded.

In the same light, Jesus is teaching us today of the need to persist in prayer and never lose heart. Just as Jack Ma persisted and achieved his dream, so we too need to persist in prayer to accomplish what God wants for us and what is good for us. Jesus said this to the people when he taught them, using a parable, on the need to pray continually and never lose heart. He says, there was in a certain town an unjust judge who neither was afraid of God nor of man. In this same town was a poor widow who had a case against one of her enemies. The poor widow kept going to this unjust judge, asking him to judge her case, and the judge wouldn't. She kept pestering him day and night. Eventually, the unjust judge had no choice but to grant the poor widow's demand. This is what he said to himself: "Though I neither fear God nor regard man, yet because this widow bothers me, I will vindicate her, or she will wear me out by her continual coming" (Lk 18:1-6). He gave the woman the justice she wanted, not because he wanted to, but because the woman kept coming to disturb him.

The above parable, as Jesus told us at the beginning, invites us to be like this widow. Jesus wants us to pray continually and never lose heart. If this widow had lost heart because the unjust judge did not want to listen to her, she wouldn't have had justice at the end of the day. Her persistence won her the case.

Dear friends in Christ, we too need to persist in prayer. Pray without losing heart. Pray continually. We sometimes get worked up and abandon prayer because we have been praying for something which God has not given us. We forget that God knows what is best for us and sometimes just wants to see the effort we make to achieve the things we ask for.

There is a saying that I have always had to depend on. It says we should pray as if everything depends on God and work as if everything depends on us. In this sense, we should put in the required effort and energy on both sides: prayer and work.

In the first reading, we find Moses interceding for his people as they fought the Amalekites. While the Jews were at the battlefield with the Amalekites, Moses was on the mountain interceding for the Jews. As long as Moses' hands remained up, the Jews were gaining the victory. But once his hands got tired and went down, the Amalekites took over the victory. Aaron and Hur eventually devised a way to keep Moses' hands raised throughout the day, which helped the Israelites achieve victory. If Moses had given up because his hands were pained, and if Aaron and Hur had not devised a means to keep Moses in the winning position, the victory would not have been theirs. We too should not give up praying continually and interceding for others.

The need to intercede for others and pray for them fits within the context of our mission as Christians. Every one of us is called to mission, to be a missionary to ourselves and to others. Therefore, we must bring God's Word every day to every person by being part of the church's mission ad gentes or by supporting the work of evangelisation in the church.

May we pray today for the graces we need to pray continually without losing heart, and also to strive every day to support the work of missions in our Church.

NEW APPROACH TO GODPARENTS FOR BAPTISM

We have come to realise that some parents do not understand the difference between a Godparent and a witness for baptism. This has led to situations where none Catholics have stood as Godparents for their children. As a clarification, a witness at baptism can be anyone from any denomination or one without a religion. But a Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and one who is able to receive the sacraments. In this light, we would be introducing a form that parents who want their children to be baptised must send to the Godparents so that their Parish priest can fill and sign to testify that they are practicing Catholics and regular in their sacramental lives.
